

A PERMIT



Operations for the first mineteen days of January were limited to the maintenance of defensive positions in support of the 318th Infantry Regiment as it covered its portion of the South flank of the "Bulge". This period was spent in further improvement of the battery positions for all round defense, especially in regard to tank attack and patrol infiltration. Daily registration checks were made when visibility permitted. Metro messages originating with both Division Artillery and the 93rd Signal Battalion were received and all defensive fires data was kept up to date with latest corrections.

On 19 January an elaborate preparation was planned to support the attack of the 318th Infantry Regiment in a drive to the North. The fire power of four additional battalions was secured in addition to a platoon of 4.2 inch mortars which had been attached to us for fire control. The preparation was never fired when patrols found the town and surrounding ground unoccupied. Another preparation was worked out for continued support but a "sneak" attack

made its firing unnecessary.

on 23 January the Division was assigned a new sector at the Southwestern end of the "Bulge". The battalion displaced to new positions the following day with a mission of General Support, reinforcing the fires of the 313th Field Artillery Battalion. Several displacements were made which were coordinated by the 313th Field Artillery Battalion. This was one of the few times that the battalion has had a General Support mission during an attack and it was marked by the general lack of information concerning both our own and enemy Infantry activity. During the night of 24 January a new type (for us) preparation was fired by all reinforcing battalions in support of the following early morning attack. It consisted of ToT's fired on picked spots at intervals, throughout the night.

After the successful completion of this operation the Division was relieved by elements of the 17th Airborne Division and displaced by unit to positions formerly occupied by the 4th Division. This battalion once again resumed its normal mission of Direct Support of the 318th Infantry Regiment on 28 January. It occupied positions organized by the previous battalion taking over all installations including a complete wire net. Extensive defensive fire, counter preparation and counter attack plans have been drawn

up and prepared.

Remarks and Comments.

The month of January was one of extremely cold weather and heavy snow fall. The operating efficiency of the battalion was not impliced by this fact. The howitzer tube cleaning problem was much simplified by the new cleaning fluid issued for cold weather maintenance. The heavy snow blanket made mine detection impossible since the mine detectors will not operate through heavy snow.

The quality of the Graphical Firing Table is very poor. They have proven very unsatisfactory for continuous field service. The indicator window is very brittle and replacements are unobtainable. A much better rule could be constructed of DOW metal or aluminum with etched graduations and numbers.



The standard issue 1/25,000 yard range deflection fan is too long for light battalions and must be cut down to be usable. The material is too thin and the graduations and numbers wear off the back after two months of usage. We have made usable a set by engraving and filling in with black wax the graduations and numbers on the fans we now have.

The Horizontal Control Operator and Vertical Control Operator boards as issued are too large and must be cut down for light battalions. The five ply construction, while preventing warping, presents a hard surface for the plotting pins. A white instead of a yellow pine board would be much more satisfactory.

After a ground observation post, manned by personnel inexperienced in small and large T methods of fire, had experienced great difficulty in obtaining an adjustment using forward observer methods because of the great range to the target, the battalion fire direction center gave instructions to the observer to measure deviation in mils and make positive range sensings only on line shots. Fire direction center then converted the sensings and deviations into commands for the battery and quickly obtained an effective adjustment. This procedure was followed on several occasions with excellent results.

SECTION II

1st January 1945 - 31 January 1945:

During the first twenty days of the period 314th Field Artillery Battalion had the mission of direct support of the 318th Infantry Regiment. The mission of the Combat Team was a defensive one. We established liaison with Regiment, each of the Infantry Battalions, and Forward Observer teams were sent to each Infantry Company.

During this period we established four ground Observation Posts which were manned twenty-four hours a day. Each Observation Post was given a reference point and all were surveyed in. The coordinates of all locations were passed on to higher headquarters. These Observation Posts were established for a twofold purpose; to cover likely avenues of approach and, to get flash readings on enemy guns. The day-light results were poor due to weather conditions but night readings on flashes were very successful. When more than one Observation Post secured a reading on the same flash we were able by long base intersection to locate the weapon firing. On each of these intersections we requested higher headquarters to fire a Time on Target. As far as we know the results were successful as no further activity was reported from these locations.

All Observation Posts and Forward Observers had both wire and radio communication. Each Observation Post had a direct line plus a party line. It was due to the party line that we were able to get more than one instrument on the same flash. A party line also gives us an extra means of communication.

During the period of 21-28 January we had a General Support Mission reinforcing the fires of the 313th Field Artillery Battalion. We established Liaison to the Direct Support Battalion and supplied Forward Observers and crews. We also maintained liaison with our combat team, 318th Infantry Regiment.

On 28 January the Division received new orders moving it to the vicinity of Haller where we took over the defenses of the sector from the Fourth Infantry Division and assumed the mission of direct support of 318th Infantry Regiment.

In this new location five Observation Posts were established, two of which were manned by the reinforcing battalions, 974th Field Artillery Battalion and 512th Field Artillery Battalion. All Observation Posts were surveyed in and given a reference point. In this position also double Observation Post lines were laid, one of which was a party line.

All during the period Air Observation was coordinated with the reinforcing battalions and a schedule was made out so that observation would be continuous. (weather permitting)

Maps of the 1/25000 meter grid were issued and in large enough quantity for our use. The contour lines of these maps are very inaccurate and it is impossible to determine the correct altitudes of any one point. The issue of 1/50000 meter grid has been inadequate.



COMMENTS

The Table of Organization for Forward Observer crews is well below the number actually used and after a few casualties untrained men have to be called upon.

SECTION III

1st January 1945 to 31 January 1945:

The function of supply has in general been satisfactory. Reports are rendered by respective classification.

CLASS I

Rations are coming in regularly but the variety and quantity of meat and green vegetables is insufficient. This is particularly true in the firing batteries where the men perform long hours of manual labor.

Condiments are not being issued in sufficient quantities. With the limited

menues comdiments for baking are desired.

CLASS II

There is an acute shortage of acetate and scotch tape. These items are very important to an artillery battalion as they facilitate the accurate delivery of fire.

Recent issues of clothing have included shoepacs, camouflage suits, and long leather mittens for use of forward observers and crews. The basis of issue on the above items has been thirty (30) per Battalion. This number is inadequate as there are sixty (60) officers and men employed in this job.

Shoes and field jackets are extremely hard to replace.

CLASS III

Requirements have been met satisfactorily.

CLASS IV

Resupply of ammunition has been very satisfactory. We have encountered no difficulty in drawing ammunitions of the same lot number.

MOTOR NOTES

There is a critical shortage of tires for 1/4 ton and 2-1/2 ton vehicles.

MEDICAL NOTES

Medical evacuations and supply has been satisfactory.

Recommendations:

1. That green vegetables and fresh meat be issued in greater quantity.

2. That scotch tape and acetate be made available.

3. That full rather than token issues be made on shoepacs, camouflage suits, and long leather palm mittens.

4. That replacements for worn out shoes and field jackets be made available.

SECTION IV

1 January 1945 - 31 January 1945:

Message Center traffic during the month was comparatively heavy with approximately 900 items of Administrative nature handled.

Personnel of the Battalion sent home approximately \$6,000.00 and purchased air mail envelopes and stamps in the value of \$540.00 thru the Battalion Mail Clerk.
