
General Summary of the Activities of the 318th Regt, 80th Div, during the period 18-24 December 1944. Information was received in an interview with Capt.Frederick J. Maxsted, Regt S-3, at Wiltz, on 26 January 1945. Interviewer: Capt. Dello G Dayton.

The 318th was in France, when it was ordered to At 1000 on December relieve the 4th Armored Division in the line. 1 at Bu Etting, and Budchmidtviller, Int Bow Bellevillen 18 the regiment closed at Betty ler prepared to execute the relief, but at 2100 was informed it would not relieve the 4th Armored Later the same night the regiment was alerted for movement to another sector. At 0100 the 19th the regiment requested 82 Quartermaster trucks for the prospective movement. The regiment pulled out of Bettveiler at 1400 on the same day and headed north. The exact mission was unknown but the regiment knew it was being sent to assist in stopping the German counterattack. THEXEGENERAL AND ATTACKS THE division IP at Sarralbe was crossed at 1700 and the regiment proceeded to Luxembourg via the following route: Sarralbe-Sarre Union-St Avold, Metz, Esch-Bascharage. When the regiment started its road march it was notified that it would be met by a guide at Bascharage and MXXXIIIM of its mission. The column reached Bascharage at 0600 on the 20th after a long, cold, night ride. Full headlights were used most of the MXX. way. After resting for a couple of hours at Bascharage, the regiment moved to positoons about 2000 yards north of Luxembourg and were instructed "to defend the city at all costs." To the of the 318th was the 317th. The 319th, not yet arrived in Luxembourg was in Division Reserve.

on the 21st December the regiment received a division order instructing it to move to an assembly area in the vicinity of Mersch,
and make preparations to attack north on the morning of the 22nd.

the regiment moved as ordered, reaching Mersch on the 21st at 1600. 60 0600 on the 22nd the regiment attacked north in a column of The 1st Bn led, with the other battalions following in numer-Acal order. At 1023 the leading elements contacted the Germans southwest of Ettelbruck. It was a foggy and rainy day and, much 65 the surprise of the enemy, the regt overran artillery elements of the 352 VG Div. (At this particular time the \$52 VG Div was moving west across the front) The Germans recovered quickly from the initial surprise and put up some very stiff resistance. There was bitter fighting in the vicinity of Ettelbruck and the regiment did not succeed in taking the town. By nightfall, however, troops from the 1st Bn had got into the houses on the southern outskirts of Ettelbruck. The company commander of B Company rus wounded when he took his company into the town. By reaching Littelbruck the regiment interfered considerably with the Main Supply Route of the Germans from Derkirch to Ettelbruck and along the front.

the Commanding General of the 80th Div ordered the attack on the town to cease. At 1730 on the 23rd a heavy artillery concentration was placed on the center of Ettelbruck. During the artillery fire Company B was able to withdraw from the houses which it was occupying on the edge of the town. When the company withdrew, it brought with it a number of prisoners.

On December 24th X the 3rd Bn was ordered to contain the town of Ettelbruck and prevent the enemy from using the main supely route from Deckirch to the town. The 1st and 2nd Ens were ordered to entruck and move east to the 4th Ammored Division, which they would assist in breaking through to Bastogne. These at Bns disengaged from the enemy with some difficulty but were in trucks by 1700. They had reached the 4th Arm Div by 2330 Christmas Eve, and by 0030 on the 25th the Regiment had closed into its new CP at Fauvillers, Belgium.
