## MOSELLE CROSSING 702nd Tank Bn Co A cont

On the 14th 1st Bn, 317th, had taken MT TOULON with few casualties. Lt Croxton's platoon came up and occupied the hill with orders to hold. It seemed that the other CTs were too thin for the en infiltrated through VILLE AU VAL and LANDREMONT occupying the hill above LANDREMONT. The bn at MT TOULON was out off. Orders were received by this bn to fight its way back from the East. Thus the Germans would be hit in the rear. The 1st BN under Hajor Burnett with the four tanks came back. Two platoons of infantry followed by the assault platoon. The infantry ascended the hill above Landre-MONT too fast for the tanks. The tanks had considerable difficulty reaching the top of the hill. It was 1400, the 15th.

20 German tanks were sighted moving from W of ST GENEVIEVE into the FORET DE FACQ, (821-320). The tanks were dispersed along the hill, (825-297). Sgt Jones occupied a finger extending castward holding the right flank. Sgt Lerkin and Lt Croxton were on the crest. They commenced firing. Range: approx 2000 yards. Larkin hit an en ron vehicle. The en vehicles were moving from left to right into the forest. The TDs also firing got in he tanks. Lt Crexton got one, this on the western sage of the forest. The tank stopped dead. Nobody dismounted. The Exec Officer, 1st Bn, called for artillery on

the FORET DE FACQ. A barrage was fired later.

Sgt Larkin backed up from the creat. To his right rear from MT TOWLOW ST JEAN the on had started firing direct fire. As backed down 'rom creat the air cleaners were hit. He dismounted. Ordered to mount. Then bat ery of 88s epes

Meanwhile Lt Atkins platoon was on the crest of hill 3 of 37 GENEVIEVE. (Hill 380). On top of hill this platoon had come upon TDs firt is into ST GENE-VIEVE. The tanks fired some into same town. Then moved Eastward to the right of ST TENEVIEVE. Only two tanks in the platoon. This was during the morning of 15th. That afternoon a Lt informed them of the twenty en tanks going into the FORET DE TACQ. They fired at range of approx 2300 yards. The en vehicles dispersed

On the 16th, 1400. Lt croxton with Deem, drattup, and Brown ormed the 2nd Platoon. They had been informed that in div reserve to be used only in the event of a counterattack. However the lat Bn, 317th, was attacking toward MT TOULDN again. The hn had had a platoon on the hill above LA DRAMONT (825-297). The on had pushed them off. The tanks were ordered to support the infantry in regaining the hill. The plan was apparently for the attack to be launched along the ridge castward. 2 assault companies would take the hill. The rest of the bn would move toward MT TOULON. When Croxton's plateon got there the CO said that they were attacking the hill. Lt Croxto was told to get the tanks on the ridge. It was an impossible mission, Lt Crexton then said that he would try to support the attack from the road.so the of the hill. The tanks would go in column along the road. The infantry then were placed along the road. There was a three minutes machine gun preparat: on. The germans protended to surrender, cessed firing, yelled "Camerade", and the s sucked the two infantry cos in. The infantry were pinned down. The bn CO then told Croxton to take the tanks up the hill. The remnants of the assult cos were dug in and the bn CO could not locate them. The idea was infantrymen back and let the tanks blast out the hilltop. The op was ferested heavily wooded, a deathtrap for tanks. The en bazookas would have a fieldday. Croxton and Deems got up the hill. Then Deems covered Croxton poing through the woods. The bn 00 wanted the tanks to crush the woods down.
