Subject: After Action Report S-2 / AUGUST

- To : Commanding General, Soth Infantry Division, APO # 80, U. S. Army.
- 5 August 1944 through 17 August 1944: No enemy forces contacted.
- 18 August 1944:
 4 or 5 rounds of enemy artillery fell in the Regimental area. No casualties occurred.
- 88 mm, small arms and 20 mm AA fire were received by our attacking eachelon in the afterneon. Enemy were organized on the high ground NE of Argentan. During the night enemy artillery fire continued to fall in our sector.
- 20 August 1944:

 Enemy column of Mark V tanks, and assorted other types of vehicles moved ME out of Argentan attempting to escape from the pocket, they ran into our 2nd natuation advancing a and all tut a few were destroyed or ceptured. By late afternoon the enemy had been completely driven from the regimental objective. Many prisoners were brought in who were stragglers from escaping units or remnants of units destroyed in the Falsis pocket.
- 21 August 1944 through 23 August 1944:
 No enemy contected. Large quantities of Amounttion and supplies of all kinds were found in the woods NE of Argentan during this period and the regiment recovered meserous serviceable enemy vehicles of all types.
- 24 A ugust 1944: SS Captein, in civilian, clothes, was captured during a practice attack on Hill 213 NE of Argentan by Company "L", 3d Rettalion. He was from the SS Division "Hitler Youth".
- 25 August 1944 through Z/ August: No enemy contested.
- 28 August 1944:
 Remnants of enemy units were contacted between Pavillion and Chalons-

sur-Marne. Enemy delaying forces were dispersed to hold Chalonssur-Marne to allow withdrawl of enemy Panner units to E. Enemy blew Chalons bridge during the night.

29 August 1944 through 31 August 1944s
Enemy withdrew from Chalons, only a few stragglers were encountered.
Our field train was straffed on the 31st by 3 HE 109's. We suffered
two casualties.
