Subject: After Action Report (8-2). /NOVEMBER

s Adjutant General, Washington D. C., through Commanding General, Soth Infantry Division, APO \$80, U. S. Army.

The following report (After Action) from S-2, 517th Infantry Regiment, is submitted in compliance with Section III, 2a, Kemo #64, Headquarters 80th Infantry Division, dated 24 August 1944.

- l November 1944 No change in enemy front lines in Div sector. Our patrols were fired on during early morning darkness on the E bank of the SELLE R. Marassing (enemy) mortar and arty fire fell during the day in MORVILLE, PORT SUR SELLE and CLEMERY, but did no damage. There was considerable flare activity during the night. River receded slightly.
- 2 November 1944 No change in front lines (German) in our sector. Heard hammering and sawing on E bank of SELLE & early in morning indicating the Germans are building shelters. Harassing German Arty and mortar fire fell in our sector. There was considerable flare activity during the night, and hammering was again heard on the E bank of the river.
- B Movember No change in the German front lines in our sector. German activity was observed in the vicinity of EFLY during the day. German harassing arty and mortar fire fell in our area during the day. Our patrol captured one (1) German from Bd Co, 1451st Fortress En on E bank of rivor W LE MOULIN FARM. Germans took no counteraction and were probably unaware of the activity. LE MOULIN FME was mortared early in the evening. We suffered some casualties. German harassing arty and mortar fire were received during the dy. There was flare activity during the night.
- 4 November 1944 No change in German front lines in our sector. German harassing Arty and mortar fire fell in PORT SUR SEILLE, MERVILLE and CLEMARY; also FRE DEFEASIE. Searchlights were reported in the vicinity of ST JURE. There was considerable flare activity during the night.
- 5 November 1944 No change in Gersan front lines in our sector. During the morning 15 rounds Arty fell in PONT A MOUSSON with no effect. Gersan harassing arty and mortar fire fell in PORT SUR SEILLE and CLEVERY.
- 6 November 1944 No change in German front lines in our sector.
 Mortar and Arty fell in CLEMERY, MORVILLE, PORT SUR BEILLE and FME
 DEMBASIE during the day. There were a number of duds. Some arty
 landed in FONT A MOUSSON. In the night there was the usual flare
 activity.

SECTION

7 November 19 - No change in German fro. lines. There was flare activity during early morning. Mortar and Arty fire fell in CHEMINGT. There was flare activity at night.

8 November 1944 - Our attack surprised the Germans who did not believe we would attack in such unfavorable weather. The SEILLE RIVER rose quickly during the morning and forced our troops to wade through water for about 200 yards, knee deep. PM's were captured from the 1431st Fortress Bn. By the end of the dy, the Germans had been forced back to the general line HAUCOURT-ST JURE-MAILLY. German mortar and Arty fire was very active but did not succeed in blowing up our bridges. AP minefields on the hillside in the vicinity of EPLY caused our troops some casualties.

9 November 1944 - Through unfavorable weather, we continued to force the Germans back and by the end of the day, their line was E of SECQUET, running N and S. PW's were captured from 37th SS Regt and 1126th Regt. Fortar and Arty fire was received all day. The MOSELLE RIVER was very high.

10 November 1944 - Mortar and Arty fire fell in MAUCOURT, MAUCOURT-REDUCED road and MAUCOURT-ST SURE road. Tanks (6) were reported at POMERIEUX. No of prisoners captured indicates that the 1431st Fortress Bn is no longer effective. The 48th Inf Div has also lost heavily. PW's were captured from 17th AA Bn, 128th Inf Regt. Enemy front lines non-existant and no definite font line could be established. However, LUPPY was clear of enemy.

Il November 1944 - BECHY was shelled by 150mm steadily during the morning. Their scattered elements continued their disorganised withdrawal to the E, and the Inf effered only slight resistance to our advancing columns. PW's were captured from the 128th Inf Regt, who were supposed to defend E bank of NIED RIVER in the vicinity of MAN-SUR-NIED. They had support of several quadruple mounted 20mm flak guns, and 10 tiger tanks. The bridge at MAN-SUR-NIED was not blown by the Germans. Despite plunging MG fire on the bridge, our t troops pushed across, captured MAN-SUR-NIED, and consolidated their positions around town under cover of darkness. The disorganized enemy left weapons on their positions when they withdrew.

12 November 1944 - German arty and morter fire fell constantly trying to knock out the MAN-SUM-NIED bridge, and interdicting the road wout of HAN-SUM-NIED. It was 120mm morter, 75mand 150mm arty fire and seemed to come from the NE. Tiger tanks were reported in MERNY. 400 Lbs of assorted demolitions charges were removed from the HAN-SUM-NIED bridge by our engineers. The enemy occupied adalnuount-Bois DE Cansitaire-HERNY. There was very little SA fire on our troops who occupied the hills immediately NE, E and SE of HAN-SUM-NIED.

13 November 1944 - PW's continued to come in from the 128th Inf Regt, and the 42d AAA Arty Regt was identified who had 88's. PW's were caught from the 951st Regt, part of the 361st eren Regt. HERNY was cleared of enemy, and by 1110, enemy morter and Arty fire was falling in the town. Pw reports indicate the 126th Inf Regt and the 951st Regt withdrew last night. Several AA, AT, and Arty pieces were along the HAN-SUM-NIED - MANY road, having been knocked

out by our forces. In the afternoon, a PW (efficer) from the 2d Bm, 268th Arty Regt, established the fact that the 36th Volks Gronadier Div is concentrating in the vicinity of FAULQUEMENT. Later identifications catablished the 1st En of the 165th Inf Rest as being in the Bois DB HAINVILLERS. Enough were cleared from MANY and very soon, both 150mm Arty and 120mm mortar fire started falling in town. FW established that elements of the 813th MG Bm, 126th and 128th Regts and 148th Replacement En had been formed into a CT called "Kuchn". This seems to indicate that there isn't much left of these cutfits. At might an enemy tracked vehicle was stopped coming E on the MANY-MAINY road at the Eastern entrance to MENNY. Seven mon were captured, 1 officer (German) was wounded, and 2 got away. They were from a Readquarters heavy at Bm, which has 3 companies of nine (9) 88mm each. The half-track was looking for their gun, but got lest.

ANY and on our positions E of that town. The HERNY-MANY road was interdicted by 75mm enemy arty firing from the E and NE. AMPIANCE was occupied without incident, other than some No fire from the woods to the N. German mortar and arty started to fall in AMPIANCE soon after we occupied it. The lifth infrage, part of the Joth Volks Grenadler Div was identified by PN's captured in the vicinity of MAINVILLERS. They indicated one En of this Regt was in the BDIS ELVANOS. It is apparent that there are enemy in the FORST DE AEMILLY, both arty and Inf. The enemy line runs W of Mainvillers into the woods NW of there.

15 November 1944 - Enemy front lines from RJ 280 on CHANVILLE-ARRIANCE road generally E through MATHVILLEAS. Morter and arty fire was received in ARRIANCE, MMBY and HERNY. The German 165th Regt faces this Regt and seems to lack agressiveness. Our patrols report extensive booby-traps and mines in FORST DE ARRILLY.

16 November 1944 - No change in enemy front lines. Ser an arty fell in AmelianoE in spite of the fact that we had withdrawn from that town, another indication of their lack of agressiveness, since they didn't even patral sufficiently to discover our change in dispositions. Arty also fell in MANY and Honny. Rebeluerfor fire fell in MANY at about 1110. Two (2) enemy aircraft passed over our area in the afternoon, but took no action.

17 November 1944 - No change in enemy front lines. German Arty fell in ARCIANCE, HEARY and HARY. Otherwise, there was little activity in our sector.

16 Movember 1944 - No change in enemy front lines. During the day, German Arty and mortar fire fell in HERMY, MANY, and ARMIARCE. At 1740, the Germans heavily shelled our ares with all calibres of mortar and Arty. Our patrol was able to enter MAINVILLERS during the night, and found the Germans had apparently withdrawn during the night.

19 November 1944 - Patrols established that cormens had withdrawn during the night. The exact positions they withdraw to are not yet known. There was no Arty received during the day. Minefields were found in the RM station in MAINVILLERS and on roads in FRANT DE REMILLY.

20 Hovember 1944 . Hines were found on all reads leading N from Malevillers and Assiance, and the energ had blown all oulverts and executed numerous craters, making vehicular circulations very difficult. All bridges over the RIED ALLEMAND R in our coctor were blown, but a foot patrol to the GITM GABONAGE indicated the enemy had withdrawn N of there. The term of GUINGLAND was heavily sined. There were extensive minefields and many demolitions of culverts and road craters on the H bank of the NIED ALLERAND F. No Arty fell in our sector.

21 November 1944 - Enery front lines HAUX-VIENEULLES-SAMBIDERSTROPY-TALTIELING. Done arty fell in ELVANGE-CREEARDS and DORVILLED. German patrols and outposts were rather assisting, andwere billed, captured or ran away whenever our patrols found them. The HI D

22 November 1944 - During the night the enough blew down a large application in the vicinity of the direct dasheader. Many deserters . were picked up, representing a marked impresse over our former experience. Light arty fire continued to fall in Chamanda and Putthamon, evidently unobserved.

23 November 1944 - Our patrol succeeded in outling underground MARINOT LINE cables in the vicinity of collectand and Dismyllan Sun HIAD, on the afternoon of the 226. There was no contact with the oneny other than extensive cines in durantage.

24 November 1944 - Energ lines: H side of woods between 198600-165th Regt relieved by lot an, regth, who occupied above mentioned line, 165th Regt CF at Ad bend Classes, Line very thin both sides at ditch. Ed an 165th Regtowas Sudfine Englished Line stocker Q1855. lot on relieved night of 28d and 23d Nov, and had orders to go to Laborarand to deal our defense and to make a courterastack. En was relieved by 3d En, Salet Regt, 307th Div, which cocupied same ground as let in legth legt.

BA BEDIRTROFF now eccupied. Activity from PT BA BIRGATEOFF to PT Einsmillis. Foot bridge at of month morrows to intact at present. Bas w Vignout all bridges blown and roads cratered.

25 Rovorber 1941 - FT Danbib ASTROFF older of enoug. fond mined from Lengonvill 5 % to PARDIDERSTREET 4 to Have Vissoutles 3 to Bassheriessolder. AP mines on E dlope Will 400 between Rd and top of Bill. Wimefield at 807507 to 215510. Sunker 200509. Wines in edge of woods 21933, both sides of road Hand S at 210308, field 243566 merked with signs and wire mined, and enery blowing extrert and properting road block wie quilible (Time 1505).

dorpe reports column hereodrawn arty from Tollies moving his at 100 Ed intervals 1309. Also column horse drawn arty newlag as out of Foldcavilling (QDIBS). Considerable troop novement in at avail. 3d En receiving interdicting fire (Stam) at 191940 caring from due

one (1) motoreyele and 80 men appling in woods at (854505; 1 or 2 enemy vehicles from Q4049 to Falsonvilles 02350 at 1430. E FW's

identified as 36th Fusilier Co, strength 50 men, 6 LMB's, 2 bazockas, transportation, 15 bicycles. Mission to take FERT LAUDREFARG, but failed when attacked by our forces. Morale of troops low.

RR tracks fired on by Arty from Vio FalschViller. 50 to 60 enemy troops withdrawing on Hill W of Balling. 1st En receiving SOmm fire (2654). Rd mined at 0243545 and 0244540. Rd bridge at 0264547. Trees HE VALMING prepared for demolition. On prepared for demolition (0247564) in ST AVOLD. Rd from ALTVILLER to ST WOLD prepared for blasting.

Trains of 15th Co 118th Rogt in HOMBURG-MAUT.

FW reports 67th Inf Rogt on L, 218th on center, 165th Inf Rogt
on right. (3) 75mm How at H side VALMENT (0241550) 36th Div clearing
Station at FORBACH (0352657).

Patrol reported some enemy activity at 250956.

27 November 1944 - Both Ren troops report 50-50 enemy withdrawing on hill N of BELLING. 1st En Pass they are receiving 20mm fire at (Q2654). AT ditch reported to be above FOLSGAVILLAM, time 2315, will be filled as soon as work on bidge is completed. The road is reported mined at (Q243543) and (Q244540). The enemy also continued delaying devolition activity by blowing the RM bridge at (Q260547) and preparing the trees along the road HE of VALMONT for devolition. FM interrogation revealed no new identifications of units confronting the Regt, but did establish the presence of the 87th Inf Regt in ALTVILLAM (Q264531), LACHAMBAS (Q278540), HELBACH (Q286531) and BIDING (Q306515), with a reported weak strength. PW further stated that he observed no great number of his troops in this sector except in HOMMUMA-NAUT (Q300538) and that one battery of unknown calibre was located in the vicinity of HOMMUMA-BAS (Q311594). The trains of the 15th Co. 118th Regt were reported by PW's to be in HOMBUMA-HAUT (Q300588) and that all four 75mm howlitzers of the 13th Co., 118th Regt have been destroyed. Of (6) 75mm howlitzers in the 3d battery, 268th Arty Regt, only 2 guns were left and the location of these was unknown by the PW's. The total count of PW's for the period was 63.

6 PW's captured at the road junction (0260547) established no new identification confronting the Regt, but did confirs that the 87th Inf Regt was on the enemy's left flank, the 118th Inf Regt in the center and the 165th Inf Regt was on the right. The enemy had the 8th Co, 118th Regt at the N side of VALM NT (0211550) this morning with (3) 75mm howitizers firing for the same area in support. The 36th Inf Div Clearing Station was reported by a FW as being located in Ferbach (0392657).

Patrols during the night from the 2d Bn reported the bridge over the hm at Folsomvillan and been blown, and that the bridge at (65255) was intact and that energy were reported talking in the Vic of this same bridge.

28 November 1944 - Enery tanks and Inf reported heading W from Pfarebersweller. Estimated 200 SS (3755) dug in around Pfarebersweller, also supported by armor. Received 20mm fire from Vie Legges. Civ reports Arty unit of about 100men, morale very low, some deserted and refused to fight-left village of GURNVILLER, but 25 Nov at 0700, all retreating to SAARHEBUCKEN. One En SS troops also report ed in this Vic. Bridge at 276565 intact 24' wide, 15' high. Undetermined

E from THEDINGEN (03859), fired on ad Bn. SA firing continued in town of FFARMEDERSWELLER (03657). Enemy troops reported moving E out of FFARMEDERSWELLER (03657). Enemy troops reported moving E out of FFARMEDERSWELLER, 16 enemy tanks moving NW of THEDINGEN and in gneral direction of ROCHERN (03660) and FOLKIES (03661). Enemy reported in HENDIVILLE and AT gun on high gound N and NE of FFARMEDERSWELLER. 3 PW's captured Vic Bolls DE BIRSON BUSH, identified from 17th SS ascurity 60. Elements of Ren En leasted at following places: Security 60 in position in frong of woods HIRSON BUSH, (0350580) and 3d and 4th 6 a in FFARMEDERSWELLER Approx strength of 3d and 4th claim of PARMEDERSWELLER Approx strength of 3d and 4th also in FFARMEDERSWELLER, Report that main body of troops in PFARMEDERSWELLER (0365577) withdrawn at 1300, one group went 3 on Rd to CAPPEL, others withdraw across field NE to THEDINGEN (0386593).

30 November 1944 - Serman anks had crossed river N of RR bridge. Hostile aircraft over Folsonvillen at 1436. Enemy direct fire Wpn located Vic 365568 in woods in front of 2d En. Pr reported that 17th 35 medical Co of Approx 80-50 men is armed with rifles w/o brassards, fighting in FARSCHVILLER fighting as infantry.
