- 1 Apr 45: Moved from Leinsfeld, Germany to Maden, Germany. Weather clear and warm, roads excellent, distance traveled 12 miles.
- 2 Apr 45: Moved from Maden, Germany to Holzhausen, Germany. Weather cloudy with intermittent rains, roads excellent, distance traveled 5 miles.
- 3 Apr 45: Moved from Holzhausen, Germany to Nordhausen, Germany continuing to mop up pockets of enemy resistance. Weather clear and warm, roads excellent, distance traveled 7 miles.
- 4 Apr 45: Moved from Nordhausen, Germany to Philippinen Hof, Germany. Weather fair, roads excellent, distance traveled 7 miles.
- 5 Apr 45: Moved from Philippinen Hof, Germany to Sanderhausen, Germany. Weather rainy with poor visibility, roads good, distance traveled 2 miles.
- 6 Apr 45: Moved from Sanderhausen, Germany to Erubain, Germany. Weather fair, roads good, distance traveled 55 miles.
- 7 Apr 45: Moved from Erubain, Germany to Remstadt, Germany to relieve elements of 4th Armored Division and 89th Infantry Division. Weather clear and warm, roads excellent, distance traveled 3 miles.
- 9 Apr 45: Moved from Remstadt, Germany to Eufleben, Germany. Weather clear and cool, roads good, distance traveled 3 miles.
- 10 Apr 45: Moved from Eufleben, Germany to Tiefthal, Germany. Weather clear and cool, roads good, distance traveled 28 miles.
- 11 Apr 45: Moved from Tiefthal, Germany to Viti, Germany. Weather clear and warm, roads good, distance traveled 3 miles.

7. Narrative Accounts of Action:

1 April 1945:

Enemy continued to offer weak delaying action South of KASSEL and East of the FULDA River. The 6th Armored Division reported enemy tanks, out of ammunition, are ramming American half-tracks at full speed. Regiment captured 3 enemy M109s, approximately 1000 five-hundred pound bombs and airplane motors, camouflaged in woods West of airport near NORSHEIM.

317th Infantry (Reinforced) in assembly area vicinity LEINSFELD, continued to outpost towns units are in. 3d Battalion, 317th Infantry moved at 1610 hours to new Regimental assembly area vicinity MADEN; 1st and 2d Battalions, 317th Infantry, followed 3d Battalion, and relieved elements of the 318th Infantry guarding bridges in the vicinity of ORR HOLTRICK, NDR HOLTRICK, ALTBREITEN. Regimental Command Post moved to MADEN.

2 April 1945:

During latter part of period, 317th Infantry (Reinforced) moved into area occupied by pockets of enemy troops, overrunning enemy antiaircraft positions. Enemy attempted breakthrough with force of 12 tanks and Infantry, of which 4 tanks were knocked out and 1 tank damaged. Enemy appears to have no sizeable armor reserve in our sector at this time.

317th Infantry (Reinforced) repulsed an attempted enemy breakthrough with a force of 12 tanks and Infantry. 1st Battalion, 317th Infantry seized high ground Northeast of ALTENRITTE, 2d Battalion, 317th Infantry (Regimental Reserve) moved to GROSSWITTE, 3d Battalion, 317th Infantry seized HENGERSHAUSEN. Co A, 611th Tank Destroyer (Self-Propelled) Battalion, attached to the 317th Infantry, knocked out 4 enemy tanks, two half-tracks, and one gasoline truck, and damaged one enemy tank. The Regiment captured approximately 170 PWs, 14 88mm guns, and 3 75mm Antitank guns. Regimental Command Post moved to HOLZKIRCHEN. Communication with all units by wire, radio and motor messenger.

3 April 1945:

Enemy snipers using small arms and automatic weapons fire continued to slow up the advance of the 317th Infantry to the North. Enemy air was very active in the afternoon.

317th Infantry (Reinforced) continued to protect the Division left flank and mop-up pockets of enemy resistance. 1st Battalion, 317th Infantry cleared WÄHLERSHAUSEN, seized HÄNLESHAUSEN, and cleared the woods North of the town. 2d Battalion, 317th Infantry (Regimental Reserve) moved to WÄHLERSHAUSEN, and the 3d Battalion, 317th Infantry, Division Reserve from 030800Z April to 032000Z April, was released to the Regiment at 032000Z April. Regiment outposted area North of HENGERSHAUSEN, generally along the railroad to OBERZWEHREN. Regiment captured 219 PWs.

4 April 1945:

Enemy resistance was encountered in Northeast suburb of KASSEL. Enemy counterattacked from Northeast to Southwest vicinity of IHRINGSHAUSEN with an estimated force of 40 to 60 SS Infantry; the entire force was killed or captured. Regiment captured 207 PWs during the day.

4 April 1945 (Continued):

317th Infantry (Reinforced) attacked to the North 040600Z April. 1st Battalion, 317th Infantry captured NIEDERWELMAR, 2d Battalion, 317th Infantry captured IHRINGSHAUSEN and cleared the area North to the FULDA River; Battalion repulsed two enemy counterattacks, consisting of approximately 200 Infantry. 3d Battalion, 317th Infantry (Regimental Reserve) moved to WÄHLER-SHAUSEN. Regiment protected Division North flank, and blocked hostile routes of escape from KASSEL. Regiment captured approximately 607 PWs.

5 April 1945:

Enemy continued delaying action to our advances Northeast by Infantry, antiaircraft and tank activity from key terrain features and towns. Light concentrations of artillery and mortar fire were received during the advance. Enemy launched 3 small counterattacks; all were repulsed. Higher Headquarters reports that the enemy has a reserve of 4000 troops in GOTTINGEN.

317th Infantry (Reinforced), relieved by elements of the 318th Infantry North of KASSEL, attacked to the East at 050700Z April, and protected Division North flank. The 3d Battalion, 317th Infantry captured the high ground Northwest of USCHANG, and, while being relieved by elements of the 272d Infantry, they repulsed an enemy counterattack. 1st Battalion, 272d Infantry (Reinforced) captured LANDWEHRHAGEN, repulsed an enemy counterattack, capturing 70 PWs and killing 50 enemy troops. 2d Battalion, 272d Infantry (Reinforced) moved to SANDERSHAUSEN. 317th Infantry and the 1st and 2d Battalions (Reinforced) of the 272d Infantry knocked out one enemy tank, captured 84 PWs, 1 German Military Hospital with staff, and protected Division North flank, repulsing a total of 3 counterattacks.

6 April 1945:

No enemy action reports in new Regimental assembly area.

Combat Team, 317th Infantry (Reinforced) moved by motor and marching to a forward assembly area vicinity of BRUHEIM, and released the 1st and 2d Battalions of the 272d Infantry from attachment. Regimental Command Post was located at BRUHEIM.

7 April 1945:

Enemy air active in this sector; no organized enemy contacted.

Combat Team, 317th Infantry (Reinforced) moved to the vicinity of REINSTADT, and relieved elements of the 4th Armored Division and the 89th Infantry Division. Regiment organized the sector; Regimental Command Post was at REINSTADT.

8 April 1945:

Enemy air was again in sector. One enemy fighter plane was shot down by US Air Force in Regimental Sector. Enemy very active in woods Northwest of REINSTADT.

Combat Team, 317th Infantry (Reinforced) continued to occupy sector. Co F seized TROCKTELBOHN, and elements of the 3d Battalion seized PFERINGELSEN. 1st Battalion, 317th Infantry remained in Combat Team reserve. Regimental Command Post remained in REINSTADT.

9 April 1945:

Met harassing fire consisting of sniper and machine gun fire during advance. Enemy is capable of counterattacking with Infantry and armor, estimated to have approximately 20 tanks in this sector.

Combat Team, 317th Infantry (Reinforced) seized Hill 405. 1st Battalion, 317th Infantry (Combat Team Reserve) protected the Combat Team left flank, and blocked all roads into the sector from the Northwest and North and Northeast. 2d Battalion, 317th Infantry seized Hill 405 with one company, and KLEINFARNER. 3d Battalion, 317th Infantry defended sector TROCHTSLEORN-NOTTEN, seized GANSTADT and FRIENSTEDT. Combat Team, 317th Infantry Command Post moved to BUELEBN.

10 April 1945:

Fanatical, small, isolated, hastily organized groups of stragglers continued to delay our advance to the East. No artillery fire was received by our troops throughout the day.

Combat Team, 317th Infantry (Reinforced) continued the attack to the East 110700Z. 1st Battalion, 317th Infantry (Combat Team reserve) moved to SALMONSBORN, 2d Battalion, 317th Infantry seized TOTENSTADT, TIEFTHAL, GISPERSLEBN against heavy enemy resistance. Combat Team captured 8 20mm antiaircraft (dual purpose) guns, 2 assault guns and approximately 800 PWs.

11 April 1945:

Enemy counterattacked to North from MARRACH at 110700Z with CT KAUER, supported by 8 assault guns. Combat Team, 317th Infantry (Reinforced) repulsed counterattack, knocking out 2 assault guns.

Combat Team mopped up GISPERSLEBN-KILIANI, and seized hill 230. Co K captured MARRACH, and repulsed an enemy counterattack of Infantry and armor; they knocked out 2 assault guns. Combat Team, 317th Command Post moved to GISPERSLEBN-KILIANI; Combat Team captured approximately 450 PWs.

12 April 1945:

Regiment received considerable fire from direct fire weapons, automatic weapons and small arms during the attack on ERFURT; captured approximately 1200 PWs.

Combat Team, 317th Infantry continued advance to the East, mopping-up elements by-passed by the 4th Armored Division; Combat Team captured portion of ERFURT in zone, WEIMAR and KOTZBACH; captured approximately 1300 PWs.

13 April 1945:

Scattered resistance encountered in clearing JENA, East of the SAALE River; captured approximately 250 PWs.

Combat Team, 317th Infantry continued advance to the East, mopping-up elements by-passed by the 4th Armored Division; relieved elements of the 4th Armored Division in JENA, mopped-up JENA East of the SAALE River, and maintained law and order in WEIMAR. Combat Team approximately 250 PWs.

14 April 1945:

Regiment encountered light small arms resistance, mopped-up area vicinity GERA, JENA and EISENBERG; captured approximately 900 PWs, including a Brigadier General, with his staff of four officers.

Combat Team, 317th Infantry relieved elements of the 319th Infantry in GERA, maintained law and order in WEIMAR, JENA, EISENBERG and GERA. Combat Team captured approximately 900 PWs, including a Brigadier General with his staff of four officers.

15 April 1945:

Light resistance encountered in clearing woods Southwest of BAD KOSTRITZ; otherwise no contact with enemy.

317th Infantry (Reinforced) continued the advance to the East, maintained law and order in GERA, relieved elements of the 319th Infantry in GRIMMITSCHAU, and cleared the woods of Southwest of BAD KOSTRITZ.

16 April 1945:

Regiment not in contact with the enemy.

317th Infantry (Reinforced) continued to maintain law and order in GERA, BAD KOSTRITZ, GRIMMITSCHAU and MEERANE, conducting tactical and technical training concurrently.

17 April 1945:

Regiment not in contact with the enemy.

317th Infantry (Reinforced) continued to maintain law and order in GERA, BAD KOSTRITZ, GRIMMITSCHAU and MEERANE, conducting tactical and technical training concurrently.

18 April 1945:

Regiment not in contact with the enemy.

317th Infantry (Reinforced) continued to maintain law and order in GERA, BAD KOSTRITZ, GRIMMITSCHAU and MEERANE, conducting tactical and technical training concurrently.

19 April 1945:

Regiment not in contact with the enemy.

317th Infantry (Reinforced) continued to maintain law and order in GERA, BAD KOSTRITZ, GRIMMITSCHAU and MEERANE, conducting tactical and technical training concurrently.

20 April 1945:

Regiment not in contact with the enemy.

317th Infantry (Reinforced) moved by motor to an assembly area in the vicinity of EHRL.

21 April 1945:

Regiment not in contact with the enemy.

317th Infantry maintained law and order in WURBAL, BURGELESAF, SCHLAPPENREUTH and BURGELESEN, conducting tactical and technical training concurrently.

22 April 1945:

Regiment not in contact with the enemy.

317th Infantry maintained law and order in NURRAL, BURGLESAN, SCHLAPPENREUTH and BURGELLEN, conducting tactical and technical training concurrently.

23 April 1945:

Regiment not in contact with the enemy.

317th Infantry moved by motor to an assembly area in NURNBERG, relieving friendly troops in town.

24 April 1945:

Regiment not in contact with the enemy.

317th Infantry maintained law and order in assigned sector of NURNBERG, conducting tactical and technical training concurrently.

25 April 1945:

Regiment not in contact with the enemy.

317th Infantry maintained law and order in assigned sector of NURNBERG, conducting tactical and technical training concurrently.

26 April 1945:

Regiment not in contact with the enemy.

317th Infantry maintained law and order in assigned sector of NURNBERG, conducting tactical and technical training concurrently.

27 April 1945:

Regiment not in contact with the enemy.

317th Infantry maintained law and order in assigned sector of NURNBERG, conducting tactical and technical training concurrently.

28 April 1945:

Regiment not in contact with the enemy.

317th Infantry maintained law and order in assigned sector in NURNBERG, conducting tactical and technical training concurrently.

29 April 1945:

Regiment not in contact with the enemy.

317th Infantry (Reinforced) moved by motor to the vicinity of KOPPELING in Division Reserve.

30 April 1945:

Regiment not in contact with the enemy.

317th Infantry (Reinforced) continued in Division reserve, moved by motor to the vicinity of MARTENSEUCH. Co B (Reinforced) moved to the North bank of the ISAR River in the vicinity of DINGOLFING with the mission to eliminate enemy entrenched in DINGOLFING in conjunction with the 318th Infantry.

## ADDENDA

During periods when the Regiment is not in contact with the enemy, the IPW Team is utilized by conducting orientation lectures for the troops. The team is divided into two lecture teams which can cover the entire Regiment in two days.

Members of the IPW Team are constantly abreast of the "big picture" and can add considerably to their lectures with timely human interest stories which they gather through interrogation of PWs. A closer feeling between the men and the members of the IPW Team exists than under ordinary orientation conditions, making "open forums" more possible and more frequent. Large captured German school maps provide an excellent media for simple boundary and front line explanations to the troops.

German resistance during this period was scattered. Many calculated risks were taken to achieve tactical ends which would have proven disastrous under conditions of combat prior to this period.

During this period, the deterioration of the German Army continued, particularly evident from the wholesale surrender of large and small units.
