I. AWARD OF BRONZE STAR, POSTHUMOUSLY: By direction of the President, under the provisions of Army Regulations 600-45, dated 22 September 1943, as amended, the Bronze Star Medal is awarded, posthumously, to the following named personnel:

WALTER C. MILES, JR, 0532112, 2d Lt, Inf, Army of the United States.

For heroic achievement in France on 2 October 1944, in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States. During the operations at Renaissance Farms, near Glemery, France, 2 October 1944, Lt Miles manned an observation post for twelve hours while under extremely hazardous conditions and through his excellent fire orders brought much destruction and confusion on the enemy. Lt Miles' long vigilance was made in an area from which three others were evacuated for exhaustion. His courage, skill, and tenacious devotion to duty are commensurate with the highest traditions of the armed forces of the United States. Entered military service from Arkansas.
