  - e. Original cadre transferred from 8th Infantry Division, balance of enlisted men received through Selective Service, with a small percentage of voluntary enlistments.
2. Principal changes in organization resulted from changes in Table of Organization and the activation of a Cannon Company about the month of November 1942 and reactivation in September 1943.

5. 5 Feb 45: Moved from Medernach, Luxembourg to Diekirch, Luxembourg. Weather rainy, roads wet, but good. Distance traveled  $5\frac{1}{2}$  miles.

13 Feb 45: Moved from Diekirch, Luxembourg to Mullenbach, Luxembourg. Weather warm and clear. Roads very poor with many craters. Distance traveled 14 miles.

16 Feb 45: Moved from Mullenbach, Luxembourg to Bollendorf, Germany. Weather clear and warm. Roads good. Distance traveled 5 miles.

20 Feb 45: CT continued attack to the Northeast from Bollendorf, Germany to Schwarzenbruch, Germany. Weather cool with intermittent rains, poor visibility. Roads poor. Distance traveled 4 miles.

21 Feb 45: CT continued attack to Northeast from Schwarzenbruch, Germany to Nusbaum, Germany. Weather clear and cool. Roads poor. Distance traveled 2 miles.

25 Feb 45: CT continuing pursuit of enemy. Moved from Nusbaum, Germany to Mettendorf, Germany. Weather clear and cold. Roads very poor and suitable for one way traffic only. Distance traveled 6 miles.

26 Feb 45: CT continued the attack to the Northeast from Mettendorf, Germany to Feilsdorf, Germany. Weather clear and cold. Roads very poor. Distance traveled 8 miles.

28 Feb 45: Moved from Feilsdorf, Germany to Biersdorf, Germany. Weather overcast with light rain. Roads narrow and poor. Distance traveled 6 miles.

7. Narrative Account of Action:

1 February 1945:

Intelligence schools were conducted on OP Procedure, Map Reading and Handling of PW's. A lecture on the Russian situation was planned for selected Officers from each Battalion.

Regtl CP located at MEDERNACH, Luxembourg; 1st Bn in MEDERNACH, 2d Bn in CRUCHTEN, 3d Bn in HEFFINGEN; all troops billeted in houses. Regt conducted training throughout the day, with emphasis being placed on firing of individual weapons.

2 February 1945:

The organization of the Regimental Reconnaissance Patrol was begun, to consist of 12 EM and 1 Officer, selected from candidates from each Battalion. The purpose of the unit is to conduct specified night patrol missions.

Regt continued to conduct training. Crew-served weapons were test fired. Plans made for a sniper school.

3. February 1945:

Intelligence School for candidates for the Regimental Reconnaissance Patrol was started.

Regt continued to conduct training. Sniper School conducted for selected personnel of all units.

4 February 1945:

Regimental OP was established with purpose of securing information in order to facilitate planned crossing of SAUER River.

Regt continued to conduct training; formulated plans for move to Regtl Assembly Area vicinity of DIEKIRCH.

5 February 1945:

Prepared overlay showing friendly and enemy minefields in Div sector. No enemy activity in Regtl area.

Regt moved to Regtl Assembly Area in DIEKIRCH, closing in at 1530. Issued warning order to units: 80th Inf Div (Reinf) attacks 070200A Feb 45, crosses OUR & SAUER Rivers, breaches SIEGFRIED LINE, and continues attack NE; 317th Inf in Div Reserve present location.

6 February 1945:

Sent overlay to units showing enemy defensive organizations. Members of the IPW Team, this Regt, lectured to the Bns on the handling of PW's. Four (4) rounds of enemy Arty fell in Regtl area.

Regt remained in DIEKIRCH. Plans for three possible ways of employing unit issued to Bns. Extensive road reconnaissance made by S-3.

7 February 1945:

Ordered I and R Platoon to man OP in Div sector. Motorized patrols were sent out during the night.

Regt remained at DIEKIRCH in Div Reserve. 318th & 319th Inf attacked at 0200. Co A 305th Engr (C) Bn conducted a demonstration on the "fuze lighter".



8 February 1945:

I and R Platoon operated OP's in Div sector, and reported the progress of the 318th Infantry's crossing of the SAUER River.

Regt remained in DIEKIRCH. Training was conducted, emphasis on "squad assault teams".

9 February 1945:

Continued to operate Regt OP. No enemy activity reported in Regt area.

Regt remained in DIEKIRCH. Training conducted with emphasis on "squad assault teams". At 2100 received instructions to move Co F to BEAUFORT, and be attached to 318th Infantry. Co F moved by truck to BEAUFORT.

10 February 1945:

Continued to operate Regt OP. No enemy activity reported in Regt area.

Co F moved across SAUER R by boat, took up positions with 318th Inf; remainder 2d Bn moved to BEAUFORT prepared to cross river. 1st and 3d Bn remained in DIEKIRCH, continued to conduct training.

11 February 1945:

Sent overlay to Bns showing enemy disposition.

2d Bn (-) crossed river and were attached to 318th Inf. Remainder of Regt remained in DIEKIRCH, continued to conduct training.

12 February 1945:

Hvy enemy Arty fire reported in Vic of BOLLENDORF. Units encountered Heavy resistance from pillboxes and dug-in positions.

2d Bn was relieved of attachment to 318th Infantry and reverted to 317th Inf control; 2d Bn directed to be prepared to seize high ground S of ROHRBACH, and be prepared to continue attack to the high ground N of ROHRBACH. 1st Bn moved from DIEKIRCH to BEAUFORT; 3d Bn remained in DIEKIRCH. Regt CP moved from DIEKIRCH to MULLENBACH.

13 February 1945:

Intermittent Arty and mortar fire fell on the 2d Bn positions throughout the day. No indication of an enemy counterattack in our sector.

1st Bn remained in assembly area vicinity BEAUFORT. 2d Bn maintained positions, sent strong patrols to the N of ROHRBACH. 3d Bn remained in Regt Reserve in DIEKIRCH, under Division control.

14 February 1945:

Night patrols met heavy resistance N of the 2d Bn OPL, which runs generally S of ROHRBACH.

3d Bn relieved from Division control, moved to position N of BOLLENDORF. 2d Bn seized ground S of ROHRBACH. 1st Bn took up positions NW BOLLENDORF. Regt CP remained in MULLENBACH.

15 February 1945:

Night 14 - 15 Feb, an enemy patrol consisting of 15 men and 1 Officer, was reported in 2d Bn sector. From this patrol, 3 enemy were killed and 6 captured. During the day, enemy SA, AW, mortar and light Arty fire was received on



our forward positions. Enemy attempted to delay our advance by use of abatis and Rd blocks.

Regtl CP moved from MULLENBACH to BOLLENDORF, Germany. 317th Inf (Reinf) occupied and improved defensive positions S ROHRBACH.

16 February 1945:

Enemy continued to harass our troops with light Arty, mortar and SA fire throughout Regtl sector, and maintained positions in ROHRBACH.

317th Inf (Reinf) occupied and improved defensive positions. G Co seized SCHWARZEN, capturing 53 PW's. Co I occupied Hill 386.

17 February 1945:

Enemy continued to harass our positions with Arty and mortar fire. SP guns very active on the front.

Regtl CP remained in BOLLENDORF. Co G repulsed enemy Counterattack consisting of 4 enemy tanks. Reinforced Plat from Co E took 4 houses in ROHRBACH.

18 February 1945:

Enemy Arty, mortar and Dir fire Wpns very active. SP guns continued to harass our Trs.

317th Inf (Reinf) seized and occupied ROHRBACH and STOCKIGT. No other changes.

19 February 1945:

Enemy offered strong resistance against Atk of 317th Inf Regt Vic NUSBAUM (LOO47), using Arty, light mortars, Dir AG fire and AW fire. AG fire harassed our Atk throughout the Regtl sector during the day. 170 PW's were taken.

Regtl CP moved from BOLLENDORF to SCHWARZENBRUCH. Regt continued attack NE. 2d Bn seized FREILINGERHOHE and NUSBAUM and FREILINGEN. 3d Bn cleared woods S of ENZEN. 1st Bn remained in Regtl reserve.

20 February 1945:

Enemy continued heavy resistance against the Atk of the 317th Inf Regt. Resistance consisted mainly of Dir fire from AG's and Tks, as well as AW and sniper fire.

317th Inf (Reinf) continued attack to NE. 1st Bn located in ENZEN. 2d Bn seized Hill 407. 3d Bn seized Bridge across ENZ RIVER in vicinity ENZEN, crossed river and seized ENZEN.

21 February 1945:

Enemy offered fierce resistance against our Atk on Objectives 15 and 16, consisting of Dir fire Wpns, nebelwerfer, AW, SA and 20mm AA fire. Enemy presumably intended to hold the high ground at all costs, to cover a general withdrawal to the NE. 48 PW's were taken.

Regtl CP moved from SCHWARZENBRUCH to NUSBAUM. 1st Bn advance approx 1000 yds against heavy resistance. 2d Bn continued mopping-up operations vicinity Hill 407. 3d Bn attacked to NE against heavy resistance, advanced to ground SW STEFFERSHOF.

22 February 1945:

Enemy continued harassing action, by employing Dir fire Wpns, Arty, mortar and sniper fire. Considerable Mvmt Obsvd in METTENDORF (P9950).

Under cover of darkness 1st Bn 317th Inf was relieved by elements 5th Inf Div; 1st Bn assembled in vicinity NUSBAUM. 2d Bn moved CP to FEILLINGER. 3d Bn maintained contact with 5th Inf Div on the right; 3d Bn CP at ENZEN.

23 February 1945:

Enemy began counterattack, but it was broken up before contact was actually made. The enemy fired a great many MG's and mortars when our Trs first noticed the counterattack, which was stopped by Arty fire. Intermittent Arty and mortar fire fell on our positions.

Regtl CP remained in NUSBAUM. 1st Bn vicinity NUSBAUM in Regtl reserve, prepared to relieve elements 318th Inf. 2d & 3d Bns 317th Inf continued to improve and occupy defensive positions.

24 February 1945:

Enemy continued to be very active with Arty and mortar fire, but gave no indication of another counterattack.

1st Bn 317th Inf relieved A & B Cos of 318th Inf vicinity METTENDORF. F Co with two squads G Co continued to occupy positions Hill 407. 3d Bn continued to occupy position NW of ENZEN.

25 February 1945:

Enemy withdrawing across the PRUM River; very active in placing mines and blowing Bns in Regtl sector.

Regtl CP moved from NUSBAUM to METTENDORF at 1800. 317th Inf cleared METTENDORF, NIEHL, OLSDORF and HISEL of enemy.

26 February 1945:

Enemy withdrawing in Regtl sector. Some SA fire received by 1st Bn. Sent very active patrols to the N and NE. 117 PW's taken.

Regtl CP moved from METTENDORF to FEILSDORF. 1st Bn seized and occupied Hill 380; counterattack repulsed by Co A, 8 PW's taken. 2d Bn moved to assembly area at WISSMANNSDORF. 317th Inf occupied ground vicinity KOOSBUSCH. Co A 702d Tk Bn relieved of attachment 317th Inf effective 261515A.

27 February 1945:

Sent daylight patrol to LIESSEM, drew fire from outskirts of town. Intermittent mortar and Dir Wpns fire received in Regtl sector. 85 PW's were taken.

1st Bn 317th Inf continued to improve and occupy Hill 380; sent daylight patrols to LIESSEM, found town occupied by enemy. 2d Bn in assembly area vicinity WISSMANNSDORF, outposted high ground vicinity town with three reinf plats; remainder of Bn billeted in town. 3d Bn continued to occupy and improve position vicinity of KOOSBUSCH.

28 February 1945:

Enemy resistance consisted of small groups, with orders to hold up our Adv as long as possible, then withdraw. 127 PW's were taken; morale of enemy very low.

Regtl CP moved from FEILSDORF to BIERSDORF. 317th Inf attacked night 28 Feb - 1 Mar, seized high ground W SCHLEID. 1st Bn seized high ground N OBERWEILER, mopped-up area OBERWEILER, NEIDERWEILER, BIESDORF, PRUM RIVER. 2 Bn seized high ground W SCHEID. 3d Bn assembled in Regtl reserve in area WIERSDORF, BIERSDORF, LIESSEM.



## APPENDA

This period was characterized by daily disintegration of the German Army. The resistance was not determined in the sense that the German soldier resisted to the end; after a short fight, the Germans would, in most cases, surrender.

Further evidence of the collapse of German resistance was the appearance of numerous battle groups, composed of the remnants of several divisions. Considerable amounts of materiel were captured including at least nine cannons in excellent shape and several tanks. This equipment, according to PW's was abandoned because of lack of gasoline.

During the month of February, a special patrol was organized under the jurisdiction of the Regtl S-2, and administratively a part of Regtl AT Co. The purpose of this unit is to provide a patrol for night missions to be carried out by men endowed with skill in this line. All 18 of the patrol members were volunteers, including one Officer in charge. Training was conducted with special emphasis on perfection at night. Included in the training was Engr Rcn of Rds, Bns, methods of crossing rivers including expedients, demolitions, first aid, basic patrol functioning and aerial photography. Other subjects were stressed, but particular emphasis was laid on the subjects mentioned above.

Transportation for patrol members was initially by truck, a ton and one-half supplied for this purpose. A German motorcycle and sedan have since been added.

The results from patrols carried out by the Regimental patrol have not been amazing by any means, but it has possibilities that may make them so in the future. As the patrol members live and work together, they develop an Esprit de Corps of their own; the results will become more favorable as this feeling is developed and grows.

The instruction of personnel to report the condition of all Rds traveled, Bns crossed, and in general, a constant look out for Engr Info has greatly increased our efficiency in gathering necessary data for our attached Engrs. The more complete and prompt, the sooner the chow is brought up and wounded evacuated! All soldiers, patrols especially, report this Info through S-2 channels, and in turn, the Engr Ln Officer is informed of this as well as the tactical situation so that he may ascertain the safety of the situation under working conditions.

Night patrols sent in to investigate towns and report the presence or absence of enemy have proved successful. The mission may be greatly increased in its value of timeliness if the patrols maintain radio contact with their parent unit on every occasion, thereby enabling the force alerted to occupy the town to move much faster. The initial patrol often includes a German speaking member to question civilians upon first entering. In a few minutes the patrol has obtained enough information to determine its course.




1. It is with a feeling of pride and gratification that I transmit to you the foregoing commendation of the Army Commander.
