

#### SECTION V - Marches.

1. Atton to Bezaumont.

- a. Purpose: To move into an assembly area for preceding days attack.
- b. Length: Approximately 4 miles.
- c. Left Atton and vicinity at 1500 7 October and arrived at Bezaumont and vicinity at 1520 on 7 October 1944.
  - 'd. Roads were in fair shape and weather warm.
  - e. Remarks: Route of motor march: Atton-Loisy-Bezaumont.

2. Bezaumont to Morey.

- a. Purpose: To continue movement in order to keep in contact with the enemy forces.
  - b. Length: Approximately 6 miles.
- c. Left Bezaumont and vicinity at 1530 on 8 October 1944 and arrived in the vicinity of Morey at 1600 on 8 October 1944.
  - d. Roads were in fair shape and weather was very warm.
  - e. Remarks: Houte of motor march: Bezaumont-Ville au Val-Morey.

3. Morey to Lixierres.

- a. Purpose: Moved CT to remain in contact with the enemy forces.
- b. Length: Approximately 6 miles.
- c. Left Morey and vicinity at 1700 on 9 October and arrived at Lixierres and vicinity at 1730 on 9 October 1944.
  - d. Roads were in fair shape but the weather was cloudy and damp.
  - e. Route of motor march: Morey to Lixierres.

4. Lixierres to Moivron.

- a. Purpose: Foved CT to remain in closer contact with the enemy forces.
  - b. Length: Approximately 6 miles.
- c. Left vicinity of Lixierres at 1500 on 12 October and arrived at vicinity of Moivron at 1530 on 12 October 1944.
  - d. Roads were in fair shape but the weather was cloudy and dull.
- e. Remarks: Route of motor march: Lixierres-Jeandelincourt-Noivron. Regtl CP moved by means of shuttling during the afternoon of 12 October 1944.

# SECTION VII - Battles.

- 1 October 1944. Atton.
- 2. Narrative account of action to include:
  - The enemy.
- (1) Enemy front lines were on the east side of the Seille River. The enemy had been driven from Port sur Seille across the Seille River. The enemy is believed to have placed more automatic weapons on the east bank of the Seille River so that all fords and probable crossings were thoroughly covered. The enemy was observed improving his position at various points throughout his front.
- (2) It was reported but not confirmed that the enemy was wearing civilian clothes in some cases or that sympathizers were active against us in that area. The enemy maintained a vigilant guard along the east bank of the Seille River and occupied positions on an alert status in their emplacements.
- (3) The enemy maintained harassing artillery and mortar fire in Morville, Port sur Seille, Chateau Dombasle and Lesmenils. Artillery was also used to interdict woods and roads from Atton to Manoncourt. Enemy activity was limited to active counter patrol measures along the river and in placing mortar and artillery fire on areas which they suspected we occupied.
  - (4) No prisoners of war taken.
  - b. Elements affecting action.
- (1) The enemy was believed to have placed more automatic fire on the east bank of the Seille River so that all fords and probable crossings were thoroughly covered. The enemy maintained his position east of the Seille River and occupied all positions on an alert status. Vehicular movements were noted on roads north and south in the vicinity of Nomeny, St Jure and Mailly sur Seille.
  - (2) Civilian population was very cooperative.
- (3) Terrain consisted of rolling terrain, spotted with densely wooded areas, and many intermittent streams which made progress slow.
- (4) Additional note: Interrogation of prisoners disclosed that the new secret weapon V2 was used on the Russian front and is a type of rocket which causes a vacuum within the effective bursting radius which is always fatal. PWs stated that Russians considered it a chemical weapon and threatened to use gas if the use of the V2 was continued. Use of V2 was stopped immediately. PWs further stated that V1 to V7 were artillery weapons, rockets, etc. V8 to V12 were chemical weapons. PWs stated that if Germany uses gas it will mean the beginning of a rebellion within Germany.
  - c. Action.
- (1) No change in location of unit command posts. No change in headquarters to which this unit was assigned.
- (2) Mission: To advance to west ridge of Le Seille River. At 012000 Oct 44 Company E, 1st Bn (-Co C, Bn Res) and 3d Bn (-Co I, Bn Res) attacked abreast to west edge of Le Seille River. Co L, 3d Bn held up advance until 1st Bn, 318 CT jumped off at 0100 and Co L advanced at 0130. Little enemy resistance met in advance. On position at 0235. Received enemy small arms and mortar fire from across the river. Consolidated position and dug in to hold ground on west edge of Le Seille River. 2nd Bn (- Co E) in Regtl Reserve. 1 Plat of Co C remained in position on Mousson Hill.
  - (3) Communications: Wire to all Bns and front line elements.

- 1. 1 October 1944. Atton. (contd)
- (4) 905 FA fired on observed targets. 305th Engr removed mine fields and booby traps in Co E and 1st Bn area. Laying deliverate mine field vicinity Bois de Cheminot.

(5) No use made of bayonets, grenades, flame throwers, etc.

(6) Supply: Bequisitioned overshoes on the basis of one per officer and enlisted man.

Evacuation: Evacuated two American dead.

- (7) Casualties: 1 enlisted man died of wounds.

- 1. 2 October 1944. Atton.
- 2. Narrative account of action to include:
  - .. The enemy.
- (1) One new unit identified at the 115th Panzer Grenadier Regt 1st Bn estimated strength to be 80 men. Bn received so many casualties that it had been reorganized into the CT Schmiedeberger. Equipped with a high percentage of automatic weapons.
  - (2) Nature and effectiveness of enemy defenses no change.
  - (3) Disposition of enemy units no change.
  - (4) 9 prisoners of war.
  - b. Elements affecting action.
- (1) Enemy resisted very stubbornly all combat patrol activities to force withdrawal from Renaissance Farm during the night. In the morning the enemy was forced to withdraw to the vicinity of Les Quartre Fers where they had evidently prepared positions.
  - (2) Civilian population still cooperative.
  - (3) No change in terrain features.
  - c. Action.
    - (1) No change in location of unit command posts.
- (2) Mission: To consolidate present line and patrol east of Le Seille River. Front line positions dug in and consolidated positions. Regtl decision to take Renaissance Farm located in 318th Inf Zone. A 10 minute concentration of TD and artillery fire placed on Farm then lifted to crossroad just east of the Farm. 2 squads of Co L advanced on the Farm and seized it. Consolidated position until relieved by 1 plat of Co I 319 CT. 318 CT to take over Renaissance Farm the night of 2 Oct 44. Plat Co I 319 CT will then revert to 3d Bn control.
  - (3) Communications: Wire to all Pns and front line units.
- (4) 905 FA fired on observed targets. 305 Engr continued removing AT and AP mines and digging in positions and installations.
  - (5) No use made of bayonet, grenades, flame throwers, etc.
  - (6) Evacuated 9 prisoners of war. Evacuated one American dead.
  - (7) Casualties: one enlisted man died of wounds.
    four enlisted men killed in action.
    ten enlisted men wounded in action.
    one enlisted man missing in action.

- 1. 3 October 1944. Atton.
- 2. Narrative account of action to include:

a. The enemy.

(1) The enemy was apparently trying to make up by fire what he lacked in manpower although patrol estimated that approximately 150 enemy were loaced in Eply at 0100. MG fire was placed on all fords across the Seille River north of Morville and south of Port sur Seille.

(2) The enemy after having withdrawn from the vicinity of Renaissance Farm held positions in vicinity of Les Quartre Fers. During the night

the enemy was extremely active along the entire front.

- (3) Considerable mortar and machine gun fire hit Morville and Port sur Seille. Mortar fire was extremely heavy on the Atton-Manancourt highway as it goes through the Foret de Facq. Artillery concentration southeast of Chateau de Dombasel. 3 rounds placed in the vicinity of OP #1 at St Genevieve. Enemy artillery fired on Pont a Mousson a total of 11 rounds estimated to be heavy caliber and at an extreme range.
  - (4) No prisoners of war taken.

b. Elements affecting action.

- (1) The enemy after having withdrawn from the vicinity of the Renaissance Farm held positions in the vicinity of Les Quartre Fers. Heavy machine gun fire was placed across the Seille River north of Morville and south of Port sur Seille which seemed to be firing into the towns.
  - (2) Civilian population still cooperative.
  - (3) No change in terrain features.

c. Action.

(1) 2nd Bn CP and Cn Co CP north of St Genevieve. No change in

location of other unit command posts.

(2) Mission: To improve present position. Bns continued to improve positions by digging in gun positions and other installations. 2 plats of Co I were reverted to 3d Bn control after being relieved by 318 CT and took up Reserve Rattle positions as planned. 2nd Bn (- Co E and 1 plat of Co G) moved to new assembly area and constituted the Regtl Reserve. Cn Co moved to new positions to support right flank of the Regt.

(3) Communications: Wire to all Bns and front line units.

(4) 905 FA fired on observed targets. 305 Engr continued to remove AT and AP mines. Submitted overlay of mines to remain emplaced.

(5) No use made of bayonet, grenades, flame throwers, etc.

(6) Supply: Gas shortage still acute. Use of vehicles cut to a minimum. Heavy weapons and connoncompanies allocation of expenditure of 81 mm and 105 howitzer ammunition held to an absolute minimum in order to bring up unit reserve. Evacuation: No action.

(7) Casualties: 5 enlisted men wounded in action.

(2) Mission no change. 328 Inf 26 Div began releiving 319 Inf. 328 Inf moved to assembly area northwest of Foret de Facq. Co L 328 Inf relieved Co E 319 Inf on position. 1 Plat of Co G 319 Inf on Mousson Hill relieved by 1 Plat of Co L 328 Inf. Co E and Plat of Co G 319 Inf reverted to 2nd Bn 319 Inf control. 2nd Bn 319th Inf moved to take up new positions on high ground in the vicinity of Belleau to relieve 3rd Bn 318 CT.

(3) Communications: Wire to all Pns.

(4) 905 FA fired harrassing fire. 305 Engr continued to remove AT and AP mines.

(5) No use made of bayonets, grenades, flame throwers, etc.

(6) Evacuated 2 prisoners of war. Evacuated 5 dead Americans.

(7) No casualties.

- 1. 6 October 1944. Atton.

- (1) 3rd Bn moved to assembly area 2 miles west of Manancourt sur Seille and 1st Bn moved to area 1 miles north of Ste Genevieve. Other CPs no change.
- (2) Mission: To assemble regiment (- 2nd Bn) prepatory to moving to new position. 319 CT relieved by 328 Inf, 26 Div. Relief made by plat, company and Bn on line. Bns occupied designated assembly areas. 1st Bn vicinity of Ste Genevieve and 3rd Bn vicinity Manoncourt sur Seille. Relief of 319 CT still in process at 062400 Oct 44.
  - (3) Communications: Wire to all Bns.(4) 905 FA fired harrassing fire.

  - (5) No use made of bayonet, grenades, flame throwers, etc.
  - (6) Rvacuated 2 dead Americans. Replacements: 1 officer and 8 enlisted men.
  - (7) No casualties.

- 7 October 1944. Atton-Bezaumont.
- Narrative account of action to include:

The enemy.

(1) Estimate of enemy opposing force: no change.

(2) Nature and effectiveness of enemy defenses: no change.

(3) Disposition of enemy units: no change.

(4) No prisoners of war taken.

Elements affecting action.

(1) Effectiveness of enemy information and reconnaissance: no change.

(2) Civilian population still cooperative.

(3) Nature of terrain unchanged.

(1) Regtl CP moved to vicinity of Bezaumont. 1st En vicinity 1 mile c. Action. northeast of Landremont. 3rd Bn vicinity of Manoncourt sur Seille. AT Co vicinity of Bezaumont. Other CPs no change.

- (2) Mission: 319 CT to attack Mt Toulon at 080600 Oct 44. 3rd Bns closed in assembly area at 0205 complete. 328 Inf took over 319 Inf sector. Regtl CP moved to Bezaumont at 071430 and opened CP at 1500. 1st and 3rd Bns moved from assembly area under cover of darkness to forward assembly area. Closed in new area at 072300 Oct 44. 2nd Bn maintained present position. Lt Col Douglass, 2nd En comdr, killed in action. Maj Bandy assumed command of 2nd Bn.
  - (3) Communications: Wire to all Bns.
  - (4) Co C 305 Engrs continued to remove mines in 2nd Bn area.
  - (5) No use made of bayonet, grenades, flame throwers, etc.
  - (6) Supply: Regtl S-4 checked with QM in regards to expediting

Class II supplies. Evacuated 3 American dead.

(7) Casualties: One enlisted man died of wounds. One officer killed in action.

One enlisted man killed in action. Two enlisted men wounded in action.

- 1. 8 October 1944. Bezaumont-Morey.
- 2. Marrative account of action to include:
  - a. The enemy.
- (1) The enemy opposing force was made up of elements of the 1119th, 1120th and 1121st Inf Regts. The enemy was located on the northeastern slope of Mt Toulon and had occupied the town of Sivry, Serrieres and Lixieres within our sector.
- (2) The enemy had been in position for approximately 4 weeks and occupied World War I installations as well as carefully constructed pillboxes of their own construction. Morale of the enemy on the whole was poor. Even the officers' morale was not good as usual.
- (3) The enemy made use of anti-tank and anti-personnel mines. Lixieres, Sivry and Serrieres were well mined and hastily made road blocks from falled trees were encountered.
  - (4) 441 enlisted men and 9 officers were taken prisoner.
  - b. Elements affecting action.
- (1) Effectiveness of enemy information and reconnaissance was excellent.
- (2) Attitude of the civilian population on the action: Civilians were forbidden by the enemy to come through to our positions and had told them they would be evacuated to Germany on March 9. A few managed to escape through to our lines and gave us much information.
- (3) Terrain the enemy force occupied was the high ground of Mt Toulon and when driven off they gradually drifted north over rolling country-side.
  - c. Action.
    - (1) 1st and 3rd Bn CP in vicinity of Sivry. Regtl CP at Morey.
- (2) Mission: To attack Mt Toulon. 1st and 3d Bn abreast attacked Mt Toulon at 080600. 3rd Bn on the right. Co B 1st Pn attacked and seized the town of Lixierres. Remainder of Bn moved on Mt Toulon. Movement was slow due to poor visibility because of the smoke fired by our artillery. 3d Bn moved on Mt Toulon and reached their objective at 0657. 2nd Bn sent Co E to seize and mop up Serrieres then organized fire from east edge of woods and town. Co F attacked and seized the town of Sivry. 1st Bn organized on line between Lixieres and Serrieres. Co B in reserve. 2nd Bn reorganized at Sivry and moved to positions on Mt St Jean on line between Serrieres and Sivry. Co E in reserve. Regtl CP moved from Bezaumont to Morey.
  - (3) Communications: Wire to all Ens and Regtl CP.
- (4) FA fired in support of attack. Co C 305 Engrs constructed 1 bridge, 1 by-pass, and cleared roads of mines.
  - (5) Hand grenades and bazockas used-throughout the attack.
  - (6) 22 enlisted men killed in action.
    - 2 officer killed in action.
    - 4 officer wounded in action.
    - 83 enlisted men wounded in action.

- 1. 9 October 1944. Morey-Lixierres.
- 2. Narrative account of action to include.

a. The enemy.

(1) Estimate of the enemy opposing force: no change.

(2) Nature and effectiveness of enemy defenses: no change.

(3) Disposition of enemy units: no change.

(4) 82 prisoners of war taken.

b. Elements affecting action.

- (1) Effectiveness of enemy information: no change.
- (2) Attitude of civilian population: no change.
- (3) Nature of terrain: no change.
- c. Action.

(1) Attachments: none. In support of 319 CT: Co C 86th Chemical Battalion (4.2 mortars), Co A 608 TD Bn, one Co 702 tanks, and 315th FA Bn. 1st BN Cp vicinity of Lixierres; 2nd En CP vicinity Jeandelincourt; 3rd Bn CP moved to assembly area in Bois de la Fourasse, north of Jeandelincourt.

(2) Mission: To continue advance to NE at 090600 Oct 44 and seize the high ground north of Pois de la Fourasse. 905 FA and 315 FA laid down a barrage until 0610. The attack jumped off at 0600 with 1st and 2nd Bns abreast. 1st Bn on the left. 1 Co tanks in 1st Bn sector prepared to fire on Pois de la F Fourasse woods in support of 2nd Pn advance. 3rd Pn remained in Re th Reserve in Servieres. 1st En advanced rapidly meeting light resistance. 2nd Bn advance hindered by woods. 1st Bn was on objective at 0920 and organized positions. At 1300 3d Bn began movement to assembly area in Bois de la Fourasse (9130). 2nd Bn reached objective at 1445 and began digging in under artillery fire. Regth CP moved from Morey to Lixierres at 1730. 3d Bn closed in new assembly area at 1800. Co L sent to close gap between 1st and 2nd En. Peceived counter-attack from direction of Abaucourt and Letricourt. All counter-attacks beaten off. Positions consolidated for the night.

(3) Communication: Wire to rear CP's and OP. Padio to forward

troops. Had difficulty with communication due chiefly to lack of wire.

- (4) 905 and 315 FA fired in support of attack and fired smoke on call. Co C 305 Engrs supported attack by clearing roads and woods of AT and AP mines. Continued to work on by-pass north of Morey.
  - (5) Use of bayonet, grenades, flame throwers, etc: not used.

(6) Evacuated three American dead and fifteen German dead.

(7) Casualties: One enlisted man killed in action.
One enlisted man died of wounds.
Eight enlisted men wounded in action.

- 10 October 1944. Jixierres.
- Narrative account of action to include: 2.

a. The enemy.

(1) The enemy opposing force consisted of approximately 5 assault

guns and between 200 and 300 infantrymen.

(2) The enemy having commanding ground is able to observe well into Enemy patrols have been beaten off and it is not believed that any our sector. of them have penetrated into our lines.

- (3) The enemy made a counter-attack with 5 assault guns and between 200 and 300 infantry on our sector between the Seille River and Bois du Haut des Trappes. The enemy succeeded in throwing our troops back temporarily and the attack resulted in the enemy digging in positions closer to our lines. The enemy used considerable mortar and artillery fire on our troops, most of the fire consisting of 80 and 120 mm mortar fire. Our troops counterattacked in the late afternoon and threw the enery from his newly won positions and resulted in the capture of 53 prisoners. Two enemy aircraft were reported late last night (9 Oct 44) at approximately 19000 feet. Enemy air activity otherwise has been limited in this sector. Considerable enemy 80mm mortar ammunition had been captured and was used to fire on areas which is normally impracticable for our nortar range. At least 1 120mm mortar and some ammunition was captured and this mortar was used to fire upon the enemy front lines.
  - (4) 53 prisoners of war taken.

Elements affecting action.

- (1) Effectiveness of enemy information and reconnaissance: no change.
- (2) Civilian population for the most part had been evacuated, however, it was quite noticeable that the remaining civilians did not contribute a great deal of enemy information.

(3) Terrain is rolling with several high points in our sector and in the area held by the enemy. Considerable wet weather made armor impossible to

operate effectively.

(1) No change in Location of unit command posts. Co C 608 TD Bn relieved by Co C 602 TD Bn. Co C 702 Tank En and 1 plat of Co C 86th Chemical Bn

in support of 519 CT.

(2) Fission: To hold the high ground. Pns continued to dig in and improve positions. 2nd Bn received heavy a tillery fire. 2nd Bn withdrew from the high ground to the north edge of the woods. 3rd Bn (- Co L) plus 1 Co tanks and 2 platoens of TDs alerted to counter-attack against left flank of the enemy and restore 2nd Pn positions. Counter-attack jumped off at 1730. Attack progressed rapidly and Co E and F 2nd Pn were on position on high ground at 2030. Co L 3d En remained in position. Co G and Bn filled in gap betreen Co L and Co F on high ground. 1st In remained in possition and supported 3d Bn attack by mortar and MG fire. 3rd Bn (= Co L) after 2nd Pn occupied the high ground, withdrew to Rogth reserve position.

(5) Communications: wire and radio to bms. (4) 905 FA fired on observed targets and insupport of 3rd bn attack.

- 1. 10 October 1944 (contd)
- 2. c. Action. (contd)

(4) Co C 305 Engrs contined to remove mines in road net vicinity Lixierres, checked Lixierres completely, checked Scrievres for AT and AP mines.

(5) Use not made of bayonet, grenades, flame throwers, etc.

- (6) Evacuated 135 prisoners of var. Evacuated two American dead and six German dead.

  - (6) Casualties: None.

#### SECTION VIII - Commanding Officers in Important Engagements.

- 1. North of Benicourt, France, on 2 October 1944.
- 2. 1st Lt Norman A. Moe, CO of Company L, alerted his company at 1900 on 1 October 1944 for a night attack. The company mission was to attack, search and secure the woods north of Benicourt. Company left the battalion area at 2200 and proceeded on foot approximately four (4) miles to an assembly area. The attack started at 0130 on 2 October 1944 and the mission was accomplished at 0300. He reorganized his company after the attack and set up defensive positions in sector 1 mile southwest of Benicourt. Nine (9) prisoners were taken and many enemy casualties inflicted. Enemy offered a very strong resistance of undetermined strength.
  - 1. Sivry, France, on 8 October 1944.
- 2. Capt Morgan L. Tenny, CO of Company "F", alerted his company at 1100 to prepare attack on the town of Sivry. The attack jumped off at 1215 meeting strong enemy resistance but the mission was accomplished at 1600. Prisoners taken during the attack consisted of three (3) German Officers and 140 enlisted men. Again on 9 October 1944, in conjunction with Company "G", Capt Tenny led his company in the attack on the high ground of Mt St Jean with an additional mission to clean out the adjacent woods. At 0615 the attack jumped off and at 1700 the mission was completed successfully. During the night of 9 October the enemy counterattacked but was repulsed and a defensive position was set up.
  - 1. Vicinity of Nomeny, France, on 9 October 1944.
- 2. Lt Col Hiram D. Ives, CO of 1st Battalion, coordinated the attack on the high ground south of Nomeny. The attack jumped off at 0600 with Companies "B" and "C" as leading assault companies. Heavy enemy artillery fire was encountered but the battalion gained the high ground at 0920. Upon securing their objective the battalion immediately set up defensive positions according to previous plans devised by Col Ives. Capt Samuel L. Williams was in command of Company "B" with Capt Myron Gold in command of Company "C".
  - 1. Serrieres, France, on 9 October 1944.
- 2. Capt Garland D. Godby, CO of Company E, moved his company into an assembly area on the night of 8 October and drew up plans for the attack on Serrieres on 9 October. At O615 the attack jumped off with the company reinforced with tanks and a platoon of heavy weapons. Some resistance was encountered but the mission was accomplished at O930. 130 prisoners of war taken during the attack.
  - 1. Bois de la Fourasse, France, on 9 October 1944.
- 2. Capt John C. Sealury, CO of Company "G", with the mission of clearing the woods of Bois de la Fourasse of the enemy and to take the high ground on the other side of the woods, alerted his company for the attack at 0615. At 1700 his company had completed their mission and set up defensive positions. At 1850 the enem made a strong counterattack but it was repulsed and the gained ground was held during the night.

# SECTION VIII - Commanding Officers in Important Engagements (contd)

1. Bois du Fort des Trappes, France, on 11 October 1944.

2. 1st Lt Edward B. Leroy, CO of Company I, led his company in the battalion assault on Hill 236 northeast of the Bois du Fort des Trappes. The attack jumped off with his company in the lead at 1730 and their objective was gained at 1900. Heavy enemy mortar and artillery fire and some small arms resistance was encountered during the attack.
