SUBJECT: Battalion History.

Period from 1 September 1944 to 30 September 1944.

1. Original Unit.

- a. 702nd Tank Battalion (Medium).
- b. Organized 1 March 1943.
- c. Organization at Camp Campbell, Kentucky.
- d. Authority for Organization: 320.2/53 (AF) (R)-GNGOT (1-2-43), and par 1, General Orders Number 14, Headquarters Armored Force, Fort Knox, Kentucky.
- e. Sources from which personnel was obtained: The Cadre for the Battalion came from the 8th Armored Division, Camp Campbell, Kentucky, and the recruits came from New Cumberland Reception Center, New Cumberland, Pa.

2. Principal changes in organization resulted from changes in Tables of Organization, and the activation of a light tank company on 19 October 1943. The designation of the Unit was changed from "702nd Tank Battalion (Medium)" to "702nd Tank Battalion".

4. Stations of Unit:

- a. 1 September 1944: Vicinity of St. Etienne, France. Through 5 September 1944.
- 6 September 1944: Through 11 September 1944: Vicinity of Limey, France.
- 12 September 1944: Through 18 September 1944: Vicinity of Namey, France.
- 19 September 1944: Vicinity of Diculouard, France.
- 20 September 1944: Through 28 September 1944: Vicinity of Jezainville, France.
- 29 September 1944: Through 30 September 1944: Vicinity of Belleville, France.

5. The purpose of all marches was to accomplish the tactical mission of the Battalion in connection with military operations against the enemy. Specific instances concerning marches given in the summary of operations by Battalion S-3 Report attached.

6. Battalion engaged principally in Third United States Army drive towards Germany, driving the enemy out of the towns and territory west of the Moselle River. The most important mission accomplished by the Battalion during this period was the establishing and holding of a bridgehead across the Moselle River, between Pont A Mousson on the north, and Dieulouard on the south, making it possible for the crossing of the Moselle River by all units in this sector.

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7. Battles.

8. The Commanding Officer in all engagements of the Battalion has been Lieutenant Colonel RALPH TALBOT III, Infantry. The Battalion was part of the forces commanded by Lieutenant General GEORGE S. PATTON throughout this period.

James, Richard K.	Major	In controlling and coordinating tanks with infantry, he displayed leadership and initiative. The results of this clear thinking and sound judgment contributed to the successful operations of tank and infantry.	Certificate of Merit
