SUBJECT: After Action Report, S-1 (Personnel and Allied Administration), for period 1 April 1945 to 30 April 1945 inclusive.

TO : Adjutant General, Washington, D. C., through Commanding General, 80th Infantry Division, APO 80, United States Army.

1. Tabulations as covered by attached forms include daily and total figures of battle casualties; prisoners of war; reinforcements received and awards for the period of this report.

2. During the month of April two enlisted men were sworn in at this headquarters as 2d Lieutenants, AUS. On 10 April 1945, Report C. Brown, 02015862 was sworn in at this headquarters as 2d Lieutenant, AUS, MAC in compliance with SO #103, Headquarters, Third U.S. Army, dated 15 April 1945, granting him a direct appointment as a commissioned officer. On 21 April 1945, Byron C. Hoover, 02015691 was sworn in at this headquarters as 2d Lieutenant, AUS in compliance with SO #113, Headquarters, Third U.S. Army, dated 25 April 1945, granting him a direct appointment as a commissioned officer.

3. The Graves Registration Team of this organization, consisting of one officer and 6 enlisted men, collected from the areas of operation 30 American and 55 German deceased. The team made no individual burials and all remains were turned over to the 80th Division Graves Registration Officer for delivery to proper cemeteries.

4. For the entertainment of the men of the regiment, movies were shown at every available opportunity. Reading and writing material was distributed and also a supply of items through the medium of the Regimental Post Exchange. Individual rolls of film were collected for developing and censorship. An American Red Cross Clubmobile visited the units and the men were served coffee and doughnuts. A quota of three day passes to Paris, France were issued and 7 day furloughs granted to the Riviera, France. A quantity of athletic equipment was distributed for the recreation of the men of the regiment and softball games played at every available opportunity. In rounding out the month, the third issue of "The Thundering Herd" was published and distributed to the members of the Combat Team.
