SUBJECT: After Action Report, S-1 (Personnel and Allied Administration), for period 1 January 1945 to 31 January 1945 inclusive.

: Adjutant General, Washington, D.C., through Commanding General, 80th TO Infantry Division, APO 80, U. S. Army.

1. Tabulations as covered by attached forms include daily and total figures of battle casualties; prisoners of war; reinforcements received; and decorations and awards for the period of this report.

2. On 28 January 1945, Robert D. Ross, 0-2006475 was sworn in at this headquarters as 2d Lieutenant, AUS in compliance with par 12, SO #28, Headquarters, Third United States Army, dated 29 January 1945, granting him a battlefield appoint ment as a commissioned officer.

- 3. The Graves Registration Team of this organization, consisting of one officer and six enlisted men, collected from the areas of operation 52 American and 16 German deceased. The team made no individual burials and all remains were turned over to the 80th Division Graves Registration Officer for delivery to proper cemetaries for burial.
- 4. During the period covered by this report extensive use was made of each opportunity to provide for recreation and relation of all members of the Regiment. The men passing through the Reinforcement Company had at their disposal prior to joining their unit, reading and writing material and movies. At various times an American Red Cross Clubmobile visited the company and provided doughmuts and coffee.
- 5. For the entertainment of the men of the Regiment, passes to Nancy and Paris, France and to the city of Luxembourg were issued. Movies were also shown at every opportunity. Reading and writing material was available and also a supply of items through the medium of the Regimental Post Exchange. An American Red Cross Clubmobile visited the units and the men were served doughmuts and coffee. During the latter part of the month a quantity of beer was received and made available for a minimum price to all members of the Regiment.
