Subjects After Action Report (8-3) OSISMBER

- To : Adjutant General, Washington D. C., through Commanding General, 80th Infantry Division, APO #80, U. S. Army.
- I. The following report (After Action) from 8-3, 317th Infantry Regiment, is submitted in compliance with Section III, 2a, Memo #64, Headquarters 80th Infantry Division, dated 24
- l December 1944 Regiment remained in Division Reserve, in MACHEREN, FRANCE, and continued to reorganize and rehabilitate personnel prior to resuming the attack. Technical and tactical training was conducted.
 - 2 December 1944 No change.
 - 3 December 1944 No change.
 - 4 December 1944 No change.
- 5 December 1944 No change. Order was received to move the Regiment to ST AVOLD, FRANCE.
- 6 December 1944 OT moved to ST AVOLD, FRANCE. All troops were billeted in the town, and training directives were sent to the Ens for training to be conducted while in that area.
- 7 December 1944 Care and Cleaning of Weapons and Equipment was carried on by the troops throughout the day.
- 8 December 1944 Tactical and Technical training was conducted, including range firing.
- 9 December 1944 Tactical and Technical Training continued, with emphasis placed on training of Assault Teams, Attack of Fertified Positions, and Anti-Tank work.
 - 10 December 1944 No change.
 - 11 December 1944 No change.

12 December 1944 - No change.

13 December 1944 - Regiment carried on Tactical and Technical Training, placing emphasis on Assault of Fort-

14 December 1944 - No change.

15 December 1944 - CT remained in ST AVOID conducting training. Particular caphasis was placed on training the replacements in Infantry-Tank Teasmork, Bazonka Firing and Assault of Fortified Positions.

16 December 1944 - No change.

17 December 1944 - OT 517th (less 313th PA En) with co "C" 868th TD En, Etry "D" 633d AlA En Atond, moved by noter at 0700 to Fwd Assembly area W of Salak UNION. OT CP located at ALTVILLER. In blocks were established on all and leading into CP area, and sector was divided into 3 areas for patrolling, and En patrolled the NW sector; let En the NE sector, and 3d En the SE and E sectors.

18 December 1944 - Tactical and Technical Training was conducted with the emphasis on assault of Fortified Positions.

19 December 1944 - Ordered to prepare to move 517th Inf (Seinf) by Mtr from Vic ALTVILLE, No to Vic LUXIMBOURG. Crossed IP at Same UNION at 1420.

20 December 1944 - Arrived new CP location Vic BORDERANGE, LUXEMBOURG at 0400. Orders received for the 317th Inf (Feinf) to organise and occupy reserve Defensive Positions; 2d and 3d Bus to be on the line, with the lat in in regtl Fes (Rbl). Lat En was to select and organize has Position, and be prepared to counterattack to N, NE or SE in conjunction with Co "A" of the 70cd Tk En.

21 December 1944 - Moved by Mtr and marching to a concentration area Wie STRIKSEL, LUADERCURG.

After Action Report (8-3) - Contd.

23 December 1944 - 317th Inf (Reinf) relieved the 318th Inf and advanced to the N in Cla of Bns (2d, 1st, 3d). OP located in NIEDLIFEULDS. Harassing Arty Tire was received throughout the night. The 2d Dn, continuing the Adv towards the 50th R, was held up by MG and SA fire Vic ELSCHIED.

24 December 1944 - During the early hours of the morning, E Co, F Co and one LS Plat of H Co passed through the town of WELSCHEED, breaking contact with the remainder of the Bn. At dawn, they were out off, and the situation remained thus throughout the day. At 1700 they began righting their way been towards the remainder of the Bn. 1st En remaind behind the Ed En until ordered to occupy WIEDL FLULIN for the night. 3d En occupied Pos Vic RIEDLE WIELL until Approx 1400, when they pushed off to Atk BOURSCHIED from the W. They met SA, RF and Arty fire Vic Achilan about 1600, and were still righting for that town at 1800. At that time, they received orders to organize Pos on high ground SW LERGAN.

25 December 1944 - 317th Inf (meinf) attacked with 2 Bns abreast (3d Bn on the right, let Bn on the left). The 2d Bn in kegtl has moved to Vio NIEDALFIGURE. Both the let and 3d Bns Jumped off at 1030, preceded by a 30 minute arty preparation, starting 15 minutes before H-Hour. The let Bn encountered 3A lire, but continued to advance until they were on line with the 3d Jn. Both Ens met Hvy SA fire in the early externoon, and at 1030, they were ordered to hold up and organize the high ground 8 and E of SCHEIDEL.

26 December 1944 - 1st and 3d bns attacked at 0750, with the 2d bn in regth has via MEDALFAULER, prepared to move to N on order. At 0750, the 1st an was within 500 Yds of SCHEIDEL, encountering SA and arty fire. With 3 platoons of "6" Co remaining on the nighteround as a covering force, 1 platoon was able to enter the town. At 0500, all of "6" to was in sufficient, doing suppling up work. The 3d bn was progressing very slowly, and at 0830, "1" Go was at (782457), receiving time fire. The 3d Sn continued to push forward, and established contact with the 1st Bn. There were a rew bombs dropped in SCHEIDEL by unidentified planes. 18 PWs were taken from this town.

At 11+5, % and L Cos were in position outside AshkaN, ready to attack. At this time, B.U.Schall was directively combed and strafed, the strafing of ASHKAN following immediately. The latter strafing occurred approx 200 Yds in front of our lines. "K" Co continued the attack and entered ASHKAN. At 1500 they had one-quarter of the town, conducting house to house fighting. They were receiving time fire, Auto Wins, HA and SA fire, but continued to fight in the town. Heavy casualties were sustained. At 1520, orders were received from Higher HQ to withdraw "X" Go from the town, and to organize a defensive position near the town.

After the let En took SCHEIDEL, they were reorganized into a column of companies, and moved to Atk the second objective. Just as this povement started, the En was fired upon by the enemy with Small Arms and Arty fire. At 1600, the let En was ordered to withdraw to the Vic of HIEDERFEULDE; the Withdrawal began at 1830.

The 3rd Bn was ordered to set up a defensive position w of MARKEN, reinforced by Cos "B" and "D".

28 December 1944 - In- 3rd En, continuing to occupy a derensive position a of KERALS, were relieved by the and En under cover of daraness, and soved back to vic simbonfactor in legal leserve. The let an relieved the and En on read blocks on roads leading into hisbonfactor, and also patrolled the roads in the vic of the town. Contact with the 319th inf on our left was maintained.

E9 December 1944 - Defensive position continued with the let on an the right, and an on the left and the 3rd on in negative serve. For any was distributed, and the negative remained in approx 1145. Forty rounds of enough arty fell in a confound of the oneny Arty, as soving into assigned areas as accomplished under cover of darkness. The let in established contact with the 318th inf on our right.

30 December 1944 - All Das remained relatively in the same positions. Co o moved approx 800 Yes to the M, on the mose of the fidge in order to straighten out the Div front lines. This move was made at approx 1950. Sheap F47's bombed and strafed the 3d In and 313th F4 in areas. Intensive Arty fire was received in Regtl area all day.

31 December 1944 - negt continued to coupy and improve defensive positions. Active patrolling was conducted. Enemy intermittent arty and marter five foll on positions inroughout the day.

II. ADDENDA:

The terrain of the LUXEMBOURG area, in which we have operated since the 19th Dec 44, presents more obstacles to offensive purposes than any previously encountered. It features a great number of steep ravines, with successive high ground, making the maneuvering of tanks in the support of infantry operations practically impossible. The climatic conditions of late, pringing about a perpetual freezing of the ground, has tended to somewhat alleviate this condition.

The high ground in this vicinity is favorable for the building up of defensive positions, a situation of which the enough has taken advantage.

It has come to our attention of late, that the coordination between our air corpo and our ground rorces, has not been of the high caliber known in the past. A number of times our troops were bombed and strafed by allies planes.
