III. AWARD OF BRONZE STAR: By direction of the President, under the provisions of Army Regulations 600-45, dated 22 September 1943, as amended, the Bronze Star Medal is awarded the following named personnel:

John R. Bado, 15342819, S Sgt, Hq Co 2d Bn, 319th Infantry, Army of the United States. For heroic achievement in Germany on 27 February 1945, in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States. On 27 February 1945, S Sgt Bado, assistant sergeant major, having followed the assault companies into Obergeckler, Germany, to locate billets for the battalion command post, was caught in the streets when the enemy launched a strong counterattack. Immediately perceiving the situation, S Sgt Bado located an advantageous position and by accurate and continued fire, despite the strong enemy counterfire, materially aided in repulsing the enemy. Such courage, resourcefulness, and sincere devotion to duty exemplify the highest traditions of the armed forces of the United States. Entered military service from Indiana.

John T. Courtney, 32046194, M Sgt, Sv Co, 318th Infantry, Army of the United States.
