Joesph G. Weibel, 35 461 211, S Sgt, Inf, \* \* \*, France, 16 August 1944. Entered service from Ohio.


John J. Gulick, 33 320 613, Pfc, Inf, \* \* \*, France, 16 August 1944. Entered service from Pennsylvania.


