III. AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL: By direction of the President, under the provisions of Army Regulations 600-45, dated 22 September 1943, as amended, the Bronze Star Medal is awarded the following named personnel:

JOSEPH J. KEHRER, 36842669, Sgt, Co L, 317th Infantry, Army of the United States. For heroic achievement in GERMANY on 5 April 1945, in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States. In the vicinity of LANDWEHAHAGEN, GERMANY, Sgt KFHRER volunteered to locate well concealed enemy positions that were delaying the advance of his company. With utter disregard for personal safety, he advanced over 700 yards of terrain exposed to intense hostile fire to gain a vantage point from where he directed fire on the enemy and destroyed their stronghold. His heroism and devotion to duty exemplify the highest traditions of the armed forces of the United States. Entered military service from WISCONSIN.

JOSEPH SPISAK, 33282548, Tec 4, AT Co, 317th Infantry, Army of the United States. For heroic service in FRANCE and LUXEMBOURG from 5 to 9 September 1944 and 24 December 1944, in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States. At the Moselle River and later at NEIDERFEULEN, LUXEMBOURG, when heavy concentrations of enemy fire made it necessary for his comrades to take cover in buildings and cellars, Tec 4 SPISAK, with utter disregard for personal safety, remained in the open to receive and transmit important messages. His courage and devotion to duty contributed greatly to the success of his organization and exemplify the highest traditions of the armed forces of the United States. Entered military service from PENNSYLVANIA.

IV. AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL: By direction of the President, under the provisions of Army Regulations 600-45, dated 22 September 1943, as amended, the Bronze Star Medal is awarded the following named personnel for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States.

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SAMUEL J. SMITH, W2118280, CWO, 319th Infantry, Army of the United States. For the period 7 August 1944 to 8 May 1945, in FRANCE, LUXEMBOURG, GERMANY, and AUSTRIA. Entered military service from GEORGIA.

GEORGE A. VOYTUSH, 01317708, 1st Lt, Infantry, 318th Infantry, Army of the United States. For the period 17 October 1944 to 8 May 1945, in FRANCE, LUXEMBOURG, GERMANY, and AUSTRIA. Entered military service from PENNSYLVANIA.
