II. AWARD OF SILVER STAR MEDAL: By direction of the President, under the provisions of Army Regulations 600-45, dated 22 September 1943, as amended, the Silver Star Medal is awarded the following named personnel:

ROSS A. WRIGHT, 6576242, T Sgt, Co C, 319th Infantry, Army of the United States. For gallantry in action in LUXEMBOURG on 27 December 1944, in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States. At RINGEL, LUXEMBOURG, a pressing enemy counterattack inflicted severe casualties on T Sgt WRIGHT'S and the adjacent squad. Without hesitation, he organized both into better positions. Moving close to an enemy position he eliminated a machine gun with a rifle grenade and inspired his men to repel each enemy thrust. His leadership and devotion to duty exemplify the highest traditions of the armed forces of the United States. Entered military service from ILLINOIS.
