I. AWARD OF SILVER STAR: By direction of the President, under the provisions of Army Regulations 600-45, dated 22 September 1943, as amended, the Silver Star Medal is awarded the following named personnel:

Alfred E. Day, Jr, 39151597, Sgt, Inf, Army of the United States. For gallantry in action in Belgium on 26 December 1944, in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States. On 26 December 1944, while the mortar section squad led by Sgt Day was establishing positions after attaining an objective, it was subjected to fire from the vicinity of a nearby ridge. Ordering his men to a place of safety, Sgt Day, without hesitation, advanced to trace the origin of the fire, which he found to be coming from a barn some three hundred yards away. As he personally assaulted the enemy position he was wounded in the arm but continued in the face of the raking fire until he was close enough to hurl a hand grenade. His actions resulted in the capturing of five of the enemy and the killing of three others. The bravery, aggressiveness, and sincere devotion to duty displayed by Sgt Day exemplify the finest traditions of the armed forces of the United States. Entered military service from California.

John J. McNiff, 31455985, S Sgt, Inf, Army of the United States. For gallantry in action in Belgium on 25 December 1944, in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States. On 25 December 1944, S Sgt McNiff was serving as a mortar section sergeant with an infantry rifle company in an assault upon enemy positions. The rifle platoons were temporarily delayed by heavy enemy machine gun fire from the right flank. Discovering the location of the gun emplacement, S Sgt McNiff, with utter disregard for his own safety, voluntarily crawled to a position from which he accurately threw a hand grenade and then assaulted the position. His actions resulted in the killing of two of the gunners and the capture of two of the enemy and enabled the company to advance and complete the assigned mission. The bravery, aggressiveness, and sincere devotion to duty displayed by S Sgt McNiff exemplify the finest traditions of the armed forces of the United States. Entered military service from Massachusetts.

Stanley J. Wilk, 42091726, Pfc, Inf, Army of the United States. For gallantry in action in Luxembourg on 22 December 1944, in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States. On 22 December 1944, in an attack upon the enemy, the assault platoon to which Pfc Wilk was assigned as a rifleman, was temporarily delayed in advancing by fire from a well camouflaged machine gun to the immediate right flank, which resulted in the wounding

of both the platoon leader and platoon sergeant. Without hesitation, Pfc Wilk assumed command of the platoon and deployed the riflemen into positions of cover. He then personally and voluntarily, with utter disregard for his own safety, continued in the face of the raking fire to a position from where he threw a hand grenade which destroyed the machine gun and killed one of the crew. Capturing the remaining two enemy soldiers, he returned with the prisoners, reorganized the platoon and proceeded in the assault. The bravery, aggressiveness, and sincere devotion to duty displayed by Pfc Wilk exemplify the finest traditions of the armed forces of the United States. Entered military service from New York.

II. AWARD OF BRONZE STAR: By direction of the President, under the provisions of Army Regulations 600-45, dated 22 September 1943, as amended, the Bronze Star Medal is awarded the following named personnel:

LEONARD C. ORTON, O1557201, 1st Lt, CE, Army of the United States. For heroic service in France during the period 6 August 1944, to 6 October 1944, in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States. While serving as an engineer platoon commander during the period 6 August 1944, to 6 October 1944, Lt Orton performed his duties in a highly exemplary manner. His excellent leadership and superior judgment have won him the respect and admiration of the men who served under him and have resulted in the achievement of all missions assigned. The courage and zealous devotion to duty displayed by Lt Orton exemplify the highest traditions of the armed forces of the United States. Entered military service from Washington.

J. C. Prince, 34492873, Pfc, Cav, Army of the United States. For heroic achievement in France on 22 November 1944, in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States. While serving as a member of a reconnaissance platoon on 22 November 1944, Pfc Prince, together with several comrades, voluntarily made his way across exposed terrain to scout an enemy held pillbox. Suddenly discovered by an armed enemy patrol, Pfc Prince and his comrades immediately went into position and although greatly outnumbered, successfully routed the enemy, either killing, wounding, or capturing the entire German patrol. The personal bravery, resourcefulness, and zealous devotion to duty displayed by Pfc Prince are commensurate with the highest ideals of the armed forces of the United States. Entered military service from Termessee.

Victor Rauscher, 6978793, T Sgt, Inf, Army of the United States. For heroic service in France and Luxembourg during the period 6 August 1944, to 8 January 1945, in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States. During the period 6 August 1944, to 8 January 1945, T Sgt Rauscher, while serving as a platoon sergeant of a cannon company has by the demonstration of initiative and by superior performance of duty gained the confidence of his fellow soldiers, enabling him to successfully command and lead them while under fire. He has also on several occasions performed the duties of Battery Executive Officer, a position ordinarily held by a commissioned officer. The leadership, resourcefulness, and devotion to duty displayed by T Sgt Rauscher are in keeping with the finest traditions of the armed forces of the United States. Entered military service from New Jersey.

JOHN R. SINGLETON, 0533479, 1st Lt, Inf, Army of the United States. For heroic achievement in Belgium on 26 December 1944, in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States. While serving as commander of a rifle company supported by tanks, Lt Singleton led his troops in an assault upon an enemy held forest on 26 December 1944. During the firefight, Lt Singleton suffered a concussion from the shelling of a nearby tank and fell unconscious and remained on the snow covered ground for some five hours. Upon regaining consciousness, he refused evacuation and gathered the scattered elements of his company and quickly organized an assault which resulted in the clearing of the woods and the capture of a large number of the enemy. The courage and sincere devotion to duty displayed by Lt Singleton are commensurate with the finest traditions of the armed forces of the United States. Entered military service from Texas.

JOSEPH W. SMERESKI, JR, Oll72663, lst Lt, FA, Army of the United States. For heroic achievement in Luxembourg on 28 December 1944, in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States. As Executive Officer of a battery of a Field Artillery Battalion, Lt Smereski has performed his duties in a superior manner, consistently displaying high qualities of leadership. His efforts have contributed greatly to the success of every tactical operation. On one occasion, on 28 November 1944, while serving as artillery forward observer with an infantry company, he proceeded from an established observation post to a forward hill under intense mortar and rifle fire to effectively adjust artillery fire on enemy installations. The courage, leadership, and constant devotion to duty demonstrated by Lt Smereski are in keeping with the finest traditions of the armed forces of the United States. Entered military service from Pennsylvania.

CHARLES D. SPOHR, 0363424, 1st Lt, CE, Army of the United States. For heroic service in France during the period 6 August 1944, to 5 October 1944, in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States. While serving as Executive Officer of an Engineer Company during the period 6 August 1944, to 5 October 1944, Lt Spohr has demonstrated his efficiency and ability in a highly exemplary manner. He has successfully accomplished all missions assigned with great dispatch and his work has been marked by painstaking thoroughness, despite the constant hazards of combat operations. He has been the personal representative of the company commander and has remained at his post until recently seriously wounded in action. The courage, enthusiasm, and loyalty to duty displayed by Lt Spohr exemplify the finest ideals of the armed forces of the United States. Entered military service from New Jersey.

MILTON C. WAKEFIELD, 0376144, Capt, FA, Army of the United States. For heroic service in France and Luxembourg during the period 22 November 1944, to 15 January 1945, in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States. During the period 22 November 1944, to 15 January 1945, Capt Wakefield has performed the duties of Liaison Officer in a heroic manner. His ceaseless efforts, despite frequent subjection to artillery and small arms fire, have been an inspiration to members of his crew. On one occasion, during an enemy thrust consisting of tanks and infantry, Capt Wakefield efficiently controlled his forward observers and directed artillery fire that was largely responsible for repelling the attack with heavy losses to the enemy. His courage, resourcefulness, and constant devotion to duty exemplify the finest traditions of the armed forces of the United States. Entered military service from West Virginia.

EMERY G. WINGERTER, 01822929, 1st Lt, Inf, Army of the United States. For heroic service in France and Luxembourg during the period 10 August 1944, to 15 January 1945, in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States. During the period 10 August 1944, to 15 January 1945, Lt Wingerter, as platoon leader of a reconnaissance company of a Tank Destroyer Battalion, by tireless energy and sound judgment, successfully completed many reconnaissance missions which resulted in the saving of many lives. On one occasion he completed the hazardous mission of reconnoitering enemy gun positions under a heavy concentration of small arms and artillery fire. The courage, leadership, and zealous devotion to duty displayed by Lt Wingerter are in keeping with the finest traditions of the armed forces of the United States.
