I. AWARD OF BRONZE STAR: By direction of the President, under the provisions of Army Regulations 600-45, dated 22 September 1943, as amended, the Bronze Star Medal is awarded the following named personnel:

For meritorious achievement in France during the period 28 September 1944, to 8 November 1944, as an Artillery Liaison Pilot in successfully completing the required number of sorties while participating in aerial flight in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States. Entered military service from Tennessee.

III. AWARD OF AIR MEDAL: By direction of the President, under the provisions of Army Regulations 600-45, dated 22 September 1943, as amended, the Air Medal is awarded the following named personnel:

JACK J. FLYNN, 01167838, 1st Lt, FA, Army of the United States. For meritorious achievement in Luxembourg during the period 24 December 1944, to 6 February 1945, as an Artillery Air Observer in successfully completing the required number of sorties while participating in aerial flight in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States.
