I. AWARD OF AIR MEDAL (OAK LEAF CLUSTER): By direction of the President, under the provisions of Army Regulations 600-45, dated 22 September 1943, as amended, in addition to the Air Medal and four bronze Oak Leaf Clusters previously awarded, a fifth bronze Oak Leaf Cluster is awarded the following named personnel:

For meritorious achievement in Luxembourg and Germany during the period 18 January 1945, to 19 February 1945, as an Artillery Liaison Pilot in successfully completing the required number of sorties while participating in aerial flight in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States. II. 
