1. Original Unit:

- 317th Infantry Regiment.
- Organized 15 July 1942.
- Organized at Camp Forrest, Tennessee.
- Authority: WD ltr AG 320, 12 October 1942, subject: Organized Reserve Divisions ordered into active service during June and July 1942.
- Original cadre transferred from 8th Infantry Division, balance of enlisted men received through Selective Service, with a small percentage of voluntary enlistments.

2. Principal changes in organization resulted from changes in Tables of Organization and the activation of a Cannon Company about the month of November 1942 and reactivation in September 1943.

5. 7 Jan 45: Moved from Niederfuesen, Luxembourg to Heiderscheid, Luxembourg establishing defensive position. Weather cold with poor visibility. Roads very slippery. Distance traveled 6 miles.

22 Jan 45: Moved from Heiderscheid, Luxembourg to Wiltz, Luxembourg where OT concentrated and prepared to attack to the northeast and regain contact with the enemy. Weather cold with light snow flurries. Roads very slippery and in some places only suitable for one way traffic. Distance traveled 12 miles.

23 Jan 45: OT attacked to the northeast from Wiltz, Luxembourg to Erpeldange, Luxembourg regaining contact with the enemy and continuing the advance. Weather cold with light snow flurries. All roads slippery and heavily mined. Distance traveled 5 miles.

26 Jan 45: Moved from Erpeldange, Luxembourg to Wilwerwiltz, Luxembourg. Weather cold with poor visibility. Roads very slippery. Distance traveled 3 miles.

28 Jan 45: From Wilwerwiltz, Luxembourg to Medernach, Luxembourg to occupy reserve battle position and prepare for technical and tactical training. Weather cold, roads slippery. Distance traveled 40 miles.

7. Narrative Account of Action:

1 January 1945:

Eight (8) PWs taken, identified from Engr Plat, Regtl Hq Co, 7th Co, and the 14th Co of the 208th Inf Regt in KEMMEN. Enemy incapable of launching a big offensive in this sector now.

Regiment remained in defensive positions. Regtl CP located in NIEDERFEULEN. 3d Bn in Regtl Reserve. Co K marring five road blocks on main roads coming into NIEDERFEULEN. 1st and 3d Bn CP's located in NIEDERFEULEN. 2d & 1st Bns on line, 2d on left and 1st on the right. Contact made by 2d Bn with 319th Inf, 1st Bn maintaining contact with 318th Inf. All three Bns maintained contact by foot patrols. Had communications with three Bns, higher headquarters, 318th Inf and 319th Inf.

2 January 1945:

Increased SA, mortar and Arty fire in right portion of Regtl sector. Enemy patrols reported operating in this sector. Visibility throughout the day, very poor. No PWs taken.

Regt remained in defensive positions. Orders received to push one company of 1st Bn North and outpost the MARK River in Vic WELSCHEID. This move to be coordinated with 1st Bn 318th Inf who are to move North on the right flank. Co B to make the move under cover of darkness. Received Artillery and mortar fire throughout day. Maintained contact by patrols and wire with all units including 318th Inf and 319th Inf.

3 January 1945:

Enemy patrols very active in right portion of Regtl sector. Visibility very poor. Civilians report type of German soldiers in BOURSCHWEID varies from poor to fair.

Co B completed ordered movement at 0315. 318th Inf 1st Bn was not able to take objective, having met MG and small arms fire. B Co received artillery and mortar fire throughout day. Communications with all units. One platoon of 3d Bn sent to reinforce right flank of 2d Bn.

4 January 1945:

2 PWs taken today stated that chow for the 6th Co, 208th Regt, was served between 1930 and 2030, 3 Jan. Distance between foxholes in IRL irregular. Strength of 6th Co Approx 35 men, located in KEMMEN; also an unidentified Co there, with Approx strength of 40-50 men. Enemy not capable of launching a big offensive in this sector now.

Regtl CP located in NIEDERFEULEN. 1st & 3d Bn CP's also located NIEDERFEULEN. Co B received a very large concentration of mortar and artillery fire at 1630; following this the enemy was observed digging in approximately 1000 yards to the front of B Co. From this location the enemy advanced starting at 1700. Because of very effective artillery fire, enemy withdrew. Active patrolling was carried on throughout the night.

5 January 1945:

No change in enemy front lines. Arty and increased mortar fell throughout Regtl sector; enemy patrols were aggressive during the period; flare activity in sector. Increased motor vehicle, horse-drawn vehicle and foot movement Obsvd

traveling from NE to SW into BURDEN. No PWs taken. Enemy not capable of launching a large scale attack in this sector at this time.

Regtl CP remained in NIEDERFEULEN. Ordered 1st Bn to relieve 3d Bn from road blocks and move into reserve. 3d Bn closed in at 1900 to Vic KINDEL to relieve 2d Bn 319th Inf. 3d Bn closed in new position at 2300. 2d Bn remained in position prepared to attack Northeast on order this headquarters. Received intermittent artillery and mortar fire throughout day.

6 January 1945:

Enemy patrols very active throughout the early morning, attempting to draw fire and determine location of our automatic weapons. No change in enemy front lines.

80th Inf Div (Reinf) crossed SURE River Vic HEIDERSCHNEIDERGRUND and seized high ground Vic NOCHER and MASSELER. 317th Inf (less 1st Bn, Div Res) with Co A 702d Tk Bn, Co B 610th TD Bn, two platoons Co A 305th Engr (C) Bn attached advanced on order, seized high ground Northeast and S of KEMMEN. Assisted advance 318th Inf by fire on high ground Vic BOURSCHNEID. 3d Bn (Reinf) Vic KINDEL assisted by fire attack 319th Inf. Crossed SURE River Vic HEIDERSCHNEIDERGRUND and continued attack North on order. 1st Bn moved on Div order from Vic NIEDERFEULEN to Vic HEIDERSCHNEID. Crossed IP NIEDERFEULEN 1015. 2d & 3d Bns remained in positions throughout day awaiting Div order to attack.

7 January 1945:

Light Arty and mortar fire fell in Regtl area. Increased vehicular and foot movement in Vic of GOESDORF. Indications of counterattack on Div left front. Enemy patrol captured two (2) 3d Bn men in their foxholes. No PWs taken.

Moved Reserve Platoon Co B 610th TD Bn from NIEDERFEULEN to HEIDERSCHNEID. 1st Bn remained in Div Res. 2d Bn remained in defensive position SW of KEMMEN making plans to seize KEMMEN and high ground NE & E of town. 3d Bn remained in defensive position, prepared to support 319th Inf by fire. Regtl CP moved from NIEDERFEULEN to HEIDERSCHNEID under cover of darkness.

8 January 1945.

Light Arty, flare and SA activity throughout the period. Enemy patrols very active throughout the night.

Regtl CP located HEIDERSCHNEID. 1st Bn Div Res at HEIDERSCHNEID with Co C at HEIDERSCHNEIDERGRUND with one platoon guarding bridge on SURE River. 2d Bn in defensive position SW of KEMMEN. 3d Bn in defensive position Vic TAILER. Bns continued to occupy and improve defensive positions. 3d Bn supported 319th Inf with mortar fire on MASSELER. 313th FA Bn fired forty missions in support of Regt. Co A 305th Engr (C) Bn (one platoon attached 317th Inf, remainder company in support) improved roads in Regtl sector. Combat efficiency; excellent.

9 January 1945.

Light Arty, mortar, SA and flare activity NW of TAILER. Enemy patrol operating in 3d Bn area captured one (1) American prisoner. PWs taken one (1).

Regtl CP remained in HEIDERSCHNEID. 3d Bn remained in Vic TAILER continued to improve and occupy defensive position. 2d Bn relieved by 1st Bn under cover of darkness. 1st Bn moved from Div Res Vic HEIDERSCHNEID by foot and motor to defensive position occupied by 2d Bn SW of KEMMEN. 2d Bn moved to Vic HEIDERSCHNEID in Div Res.

10 January 1945:

Increased vehicular movement Vic BURDEN and SCHEIDEL. Enemy patrols very active throughout the sector.

Regtl CP remained in HEIDERSCHEID. 1st Bn made adjustments in their defensive position under cover of darkness SW of KEMMEN. 3d Bn continued to occupy and improve their position. 313th FA Bn with Btry A 633d AAA Bn, On Co 317th Inf and 1st Plat Co A 91st Cml Mort Bn attached fired ninety one missions in support of Regt. Radio and wire communications with all units.

11 January 1945:

Enemy very active at night, using a listening post and patrols.

1st Bn completed adjustments of positions under cover of darkness night 10-11 Jan. 317th Inf (Reinf) continued to occupy and improve defensive positions. Regtl CP remained in HEIDERSCHEID.

12 January 1945:

Light Arty and mortar fire throughout Regtl sector. Increased movement in right portion of sector.

No changes in position. Sector quiet.

13 January 1945:

Regtl and Bn CPs gave reports of movement to the Regtl front. Enemy patrols very active.

1st Bn sent one platoon to take high ground N SCHEIDEL. Met heavy resistance when they reconnoitered high ground. Platoon outposted SCHEIDEL. 2d & 3d Bns remained unchanged.

14 January 1945:

Enemy very active with flames. Sent patrols to obtain information about bridges and fords on SURE River in Regtl sector.

Regtl CP remained in HEIDERSCHEID. 2d Bn remained in Div Res with Co F outposting area Vic bridge at HEIDERSCHEIDERGRUND. 1st Bn moved remaining two platoons forward to Vic SCHEIDEL where they dug in W & NW of town. 3d Bn remained in defensive position. Wire and radio communications with all units.

15 January 1945:

Patrols continued to reconnoiter for crossing of SURE River. Intermittent Arty and mortar fire fell in Regtl area.

317th Inf continued to occupy and improve defensive position. Communications maintained with all units.

16 January 1945:

Regt sent very active patrols out. S-2 wrote Intelligence Annex to FO #27. Very little enemy activity in our sector.

2d Bn started to relieve 3d Bn Vic TADLER at 2400. Two companies of 2d Bn had completed the change. 3d Bn moved to HEIDERSCHEID in Div Res. Co A replaced Co F outposting bridge Vic HEIDERSCHEIDERGRUND. 1st Bn remained in defensive position Vic SCHEIDEL.

17 January 1945:

Distributed Intelligence Annex to FO #28. Very active patrol plan carried out during hours of darkness.

1st Bn continued to maintain and improve defensive position. 2d Bn continued to maintain and improve defensive position. Under cover of darkness Co C moved from Vic TADLER to HEIDERSCHEID in Div Res. 3d Bn (less one reinf plat)

moved from Vic HEIDERSCHIED N to GOESBORF relieving 2d Bn 319th Inf. Closed in that area 2030 and outposted the town. One reinf plat Co K continued to guard and outpost the bridge Vic HEIDERSCHIEDERGRUND. Regt CP remained in HEIDERSCHIED.

18 January 1945:

Intermittent mortar and Arty fell throughout Regt sector. No PWs taken. Very active patrol plan sent to the Bns. Enemy patrols very active during hours of darkness.

1st & 2d Bns supported attack 319th Inf by fire. 3d Bn continued to outpost GOESBORF. Regt CP remained Vic HEIDERSCHIED.

19 January 1945:

Our patrols very active, and drew a great deal of fire from enemy outpost.

G Co relieved F Co, F Co moved back to HEIDERSCHIED. Bns continued to improve and occupy defensive positions. One reinf plat Co K continued to outpost and guard bridge Vic HEIDERSCHIEDERGRUND. Heavy snowfall caused telephone communications to be out about two hours in the morning.

20 January 1945:

Very active patrol plan sent to the Bns. 1st Bn patrol captured 3 PWs. At this time, the enemy is not capable of launching a large scale attack.

Regt continued to occupy and improve defensive positions. Regt CP remained in HEIDERSCHIED.

21 January 1945:

Strong enemy resistance, consisting of direct weapons fire, nebelwerfer, Arty, mortar and SA fire, was encountered Vic NW of KUTSCHING, to prevent our seizure of bridges across SURE River.

1st Bn seized KERNEN. 2d Bn attacked at 0600, met very heavy enemy resistance and at 1800 were fighting in DIRBACH. Orders were given for 2d Bn to withdraw under cover of darkness. 3d Bn moved at 1800 to HEIDERSCHIED.

22 January 1945:

Enemy front line in Regt sector is at a very fluid state. Enemy resistance was encountered E side of SURE River. Intermittent Arty and mortar fire fell on troops throughout the day.

2d Bn in defensive position (close-in) Vic TAILER. 1st Bn moved to HEIDERSCHIED, 3d Bn moved to KUTSCHING. Received order to move Regt (Reinf) to assembly area at WILTZ. Move completed prior to 2400. Forward Regt CP established in WILTZ.

23 January 1945:

Enemy appears to be withdrawing, with an CFL remaining to cover the withdraw. CP observed bicycle troops entering FINTSCHER.

3d Bn attacked 0730, followed by 1st & 2d Bns. 3d Bn seized ground E of SCHWILER, occupied defensive position on high ground. 1st Bn moved to left flank 3d Bn, set up defensive position. 2d Bn Regt Res moved from WILTZ to EPELANGE. Regt CP moved from WILTZ to EPELANGE. 3d Bn attacked N from WILTZ 0930, seized ground E of SCHWILER. Co B 610th TB (SF) Bn claimed one Tiger Royal Tank probably destroyed.

24 January 1945:

Enemy continued to harass with Arty, nebelwerfer and mortar fire in Regtl sector. Enemy launched counterattack on our troops as they entered PINTSHE. Attack consisted of Infantry troops, and was repulsed.

317th Inf prepared to continue attack to NE to seize HOSINGEN. 1st Bn moved to ENSCHERANGE, patrolled river for crossing. 2d Bn assembled ESPELDANGE Reserve. 3d Bn maintained positions, patrolled river for crossings and patrolled right flank of Regt. Regtl CP remained ESPELDANGE. Wire communications with all units. Requested air mission against PINTSHE.

25 January 1945:

Our troops met very heavy Cal Arty and some mortar fire. Enemy 1st Bn captured from 1st Bn, 13th Regt, 5th Para Div (remnants); morale poor; troops were trained as paratroopers, and are employed as Infantry.

317th Inf (Reinf) attacked 0400 to the NE, crossed the CLERT River, seized and occupied WILHELMST and PINTSHE. One 75 mm AT gun capture, one US Tank Retriever recaptured. Approximately one hundred forty PWs taken. 1st Bn 315th Inf Attached Regt in Regtl Res.

26 January 1945:

Was sent combat patrols to their front to establish the enemy's positions, and to draw fire. By means of these patrols, we located the enemy strong points. Heavy Arty and mortar fire fell on our troops throughout the day.

317th Inf (Reinf) continued atk 0500, seized high ground Vic BOCKHOLZ. 1st Bn attacked 0500 to NE, seized high ground Vic KLEINMUSEN against heavy resistance and at 0800 was preparing to attack N to take DORSCHEN. 2d Bn attacked E against heavy artillery and mortar fire, order received to hold attack. 3d Bn attacked NE with objective of BOCKHOLZ; when order was received to hold Bn had taken high ground SE BOCKHOLZ. Radio communications throughout the day. Approximately one hundred thirty five PWs taken. 317th Inf (Reinf) attached to TF SUMMERS. Regtl CP moved to WILHELMST from ESPELDANGE.

27 January 1945:

Bns used patrols during the night in order to prevent the enemy from infiltrating into our lines.

317th Inf (Reinf) attached to TF SUMMERS. 1st Bn continued atk to E, seized DORSCHEN and high ground to the E. 2d Bn sent G Co to seize KLEINMUSEN, remainder Bn supported the attack from high ground. G Co met heavy MG fire at the edge of town, took up positions on high ground overlooking town. 3d Bn seized BOCKHOLZ. 1st & 3d Bns relieved by 193d Inf of the 17th AF Div. Regt prepared to move to new Div Sector.

28 January 1945:

Started preparations for movement to new Div Zone; 317th Inf Div Reserve. Inaugurated plans to carry on schools for Intelligence Personnel on map reading, CP procedure, and general Intelligence subjects.

Regt moved to new Div Zone. Regtl CP at KLEINMUSEN. Troops billeted in houses. 1st Bn KLEINMUSEN, 2d Bn DORSCHEN, 3d Bn HOSINGEN.

29 January 1945:

Continued preparing for Intelligence schools, and made arrangements for an orientation lecture to the troops on the Russian situation. Regt remained Div Hqs. Training schedule planned. Troops spent day cleaning and caring for personnel, equipment and weapons.

30 January 1945:

Continued plans for Intelligence school. Sent overlay to troops, showing enemy situation to our front. Sgt Stein of IP team 76-2, this Regt, gave lecture to the troops on the Handling of PWs.

Regt conducted training consisting of care and cleaning of equipment, squad training, intelligence and communications training. Plans made for Div Hqs defensive line.

31 January 1945:

Plans made to conduct an orientation class for Officers concerning the Russian situation. Intelligence schools started, with selected personnel from the Bns in attendance.

Regt CP and all troops remained in positions. Training conducted throughout the Regt.

The following article by Correspondent Robert Richards (United Press), was carried 30 December 1944 by the "Washington Evening Star" and other U.S. papers and is reproduced herewith as a matter of interest.

"HOW THE 80TH SAVED DAY AT LUXEMBOURG"

With American Forces at Bastogne, Dec 30 (U.P.).

Now the 80th Blue Ridge Division, in a 36 hour race against time, with orders to "hold to the last man," plugged the gaping hole in American lines in Luxembourg was revealed today for the first time. (The 80th is composed of men from D.C., Virginia, Maryland and Pennsylvania.)

The Division had been resting at Saint Avold after bitter fighting in the Saar when Field Marshal Karl Von Rundstedt's sudden offensive was launched.

Due to go back into the lines during the night of December 17-18, the Division had been loaded on trucks and had travelled 40 miles to Bitch, when an order flashed through from General Patton.

The order was to move North, form a defensive line above the city of Luxembourg, and "hold to the last man."

At 1 a.m. December 19, one 80th Division regiment was loaded on trucks at Bitch and started to race North. The situation was critical as the Germans were threatening to break through to Luxembourg City, a vital communications point which was filled with at least 50,000 non-combatant men, women and children.

This particular regiment took a 150-mile route to its positions and within 15 hours had formed a defensive line to protect Luxembourg. It had driven at break-neck pace through bitter cold in open-sided trucks. The first hot meal the men had was at mid-day on December 20 after their defense line had been completed and their guns had been emplaced and registered.

By afternoon on December 20 the whole Division was in position, a little more than 24 hours after most of the troops had started. The greater part of the division had no hot food or drink for 36 hours.

Attack Ordered - On the morning of the 21st, the 80th - although on a defensive line - was ordered to attack. After the regiments had started moving up for the attack the order was countermanded because the situation was so fluid.

The trucks had gone back to bring up more troops so the regiments which had moved ahead through the snow, on foot, six miles to the West, had to slog back another six miles. Hardly had they gotten back when the orders were again changed and they set out to cover the same six miles again.

So, after a total of 18 miles of marching and counter-marching in snow and bitter cold, they went into the attack at 6 a.m., December 22.

Fourteen Miles Covered - In the next 48 hours the division covered 14 miles, fighting savage battles in rocky ravines and wooded hills without sleep, without hot coffee, with nothing but icy K rations to eat.

After hand-to-hand fighting in a ravine, one regiment swung out along a road. The road formed one arm of a V. Along the other arm, almost parallel with the Americans, was moving a German infantry division.

The Germans, moving in a Northwesterly direction in a close column, had no suspicion that the Americans were in their vicinity.

"It was the purest butchery," said an 80th Division officer. "We just stood at the road junction, emptying our magazines into the mass of struggling men and horses."
