- 2. On 6 October 1942 the 80th Reconnaissance Troop was enlarged to form the 80th Cavalry Reconnaissance Squadron (Provisional). The change never became permanent and on 7 November 1942 the Provisional Squadron was disbanded and the organization became a Troop again.

Table of Organization 2-27, dated 15 July 1943, under which the Troop is now operating, with Change 1, dated 15 September 1943, reduced the Troop to its present size.

Condition of roads:

Roads travelled on the above marches were excellent since greater majority of them were paved. No trouble was encountered in marches (all made by motor vehicle) except for ordinary cases of flat tires.

Weather:

Rain during the first part of the period hampered operations somewhat expecially in cross-country movement by vehicles which was practically impossible at times. During the latter part of the period weather conditions were fair with a slight drop in temperature.
